The public holidays are a time for rest and relaxation, and many people use this opportunity for a well-deserved break. If you are going away, please remember to complete the Holiday Home Form at the Security Office.

### **SAFETY TIPS**

### **Out and About**

- Always be aware of your surroundings.
- Beware of people asking for directions or indicating that there
  is something wrong with your vehicle.
- Always keep car doors locked and never open the windows more than 25%.
- Know where you are going and do not go into strange areas late at night.
- When you park your car, make sure the doors lock. Beware of scanners that cut off the signal to your car preventing the locking of the doors.
- Always inform someone reliable of your plans, routes and destination when you embark on a trip that is out of the normal.
- Keep valuables in the boot of the car. Handbags must never be left on the passenger or back seats.
- Do not stop at a scene of an accident if you are unsure, uneasy or the only vehicle at the scene. Drive past the scene some distance and use your cell phone to get help. Only approach when emergency vehicles or other vehicles arrive.

### **Child Safety**

- Always keep a close eye on your children. Don't let them wander off on their own or be without the supervision of a responsible adult.
- Never leave children in the care of an adult you don't trust. Don't leave children under the supervision of other children.
- Never leave children alone in a car.
- When travelling by car make sure that babies or young children are buckled up or in a car seat and drive responsibly.
- Child-proof your home or the place you are staying by making



sure that all dangerous substances and items are out of reach. Make sure that all electrical wiring is safe and swimming pools are sealed off with a SABS-approved safety fence or safety net, preferably both.

- Talk to your children before a family outing. Make a rule that you must always be able to see them, and they must always be able to see you. It may sound simple, but keep reminding them periodically, especially if you think they're getting restless.
- Use the "two giant steps" rule your children should never be more than two giant steps away from you. It's a fun and uncomplicated way for young children to remember not to wander away.
- Teach your children that if they ever become separated from you, they should look for a "safe stranger" for help. Some examples include a mom with kids or a cash register person.
- With older children, agree on a "meeting place" ahead of time, in case you become separated. Make sure that your children know your cell phone number.
- Teach your children never to leave the mall or store to go looking for you, no matter what anyone tells them.
- Remind your child that you would never leave until you are reunited.
- Establish the "check first" rule with older children. They must always check first with you before going anywhere in a public place, including another store, play area, or even the restroom.
- Don't treat public facilities as a "convenient babysitter." Do not leave your children alone at movie theatres, play areas, or other public places. Predators are known to look for unsupervised kids.
- If older children go to the mall, teach them to always stay in groups. If a stranger tries to get them to leave, they must scream and make the people around them aware of what is happening.

### **Garden care/Tips**

April is an excellent time to plant, as during the cold winter months the plants have time to settle in and develop root systems before the heat of summer arrives.

If you are living in an area prone to frost, be sure to pick up some frost protection from your local garden centre before winter arrives in full force. Planting in advance will allow you to make sure you have all those delicate plants protected before you are caught off guard.

### TO DO MULCHING

Mulching your beds will help to keep the soil temperature slightly warmer during chilly nights. You will benefit in the long run if you spend a little time in your garden, clean up the dead plants and add to the compost heap. Turfnet organic mulch breaks down over time so it maintains soil nutrients, contributes to soil health, reduces winter injuries, helps to discourage weeds, prevents soil erosion, controls pests, encourages earthworms to move in and also makes your garden look more attractive.

### **PLANT**

Now is also an excellent time for transplanting all trees and shrubs as the worst of the summer heat is over. Before transplanting them, prepare the soil in the new position by adding plenty of Turfnet's contour compost. You can also plant: • Poppy, pansy and gazania seedlings

- Bulbs such as Watsonia, freesia, ixia, daffodils, irises and tulips
- New roses
- Perennial plants such as lupins, Shasta daisies and aquilegias.

And then add the last of the spent summer bedding plants to the compost heap.

### SOW

It is not too late to be sowing seeds for great winter gardens, and nearly all cool season varieties will thrive if sown early in the month. Start with veggies now:

- Peas
- Parsnips
- Carrots
- Onions
- Beetroot
- Broccoli

For winter, start sowing healthy herb seeds in windowsill containers. All you need for a good crop is high light levels and a reasonable indoor temperature. Guard against leaving

containers on windowsills overnight as glass is not a good insulator and the cold will affect the plants.

### **SPRAY**

It's time to start preparing for the inevitable

onslaught of garden invaders. They may be tiny, but they can cause serious havoc to your plants and soil.

Snails and slugs love the young, tender leaves on your new plants, so remember to scatter a few snail bait pellets around when sowing seeds or planting new seedlings.

Alternatively, place cardboard collars (made from a 'slice' of toilet roller inner) around all your new seedlings to prevent any snails or slugs from getting up close to those new leaves. Closely inspect your flowers and if there are still a few of these pests around, control the infestation with a plant protector, or snail ban and snailflo which you can pick up from your local accredited garden centre.

### **FEED**

To keep your lawn, plants, seedlings and soil healthier, you need to feed them. Turfnet products are the best garden feeding products and have all the nutrients that you need for your garden. 

# FWG WINE CLUB **Presentation of Delheim on 6 March 2019**

he family-owned Delheim estate is situated high on the slopes of the Simonsberg Mountain, 50km from Cape Town, and it is here that the Sperling family has been making wines of character for many decades. The late Michael Hans "Spatz" Sperling was the patriarch and a South African wine industry legend. His wife Vera still resides on the farm along with two of their children and their families. All year round, visitors to the estate can experience the farm with its majestic surroundings, their superb wines and the wonderful food they serve in their restaurant.

On 6 March 2019, the Fourways Gardens residents in attendance were treated to a selection of Delheim wines in the comfort of their own estate. The wines on offer were the Pinotage Rosé, Wild Ferment Chenin Blanc, Gewürztraminer, Shiraz Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Shiraz, offering something for all taste buds and preferences. Two of these wines are even vegan-friendly due to the use of protein isolated from potatoes and peas!

Delheim produce a range of awardwinning wines, led by the majestic Grand Reserve which, since its release in 1981, has been honoured with much prestigious recognition. Their everpopular Pinotage Rosé (the first of its kind to be produced in South Africa, in 1976) that was tasted on the night, and the quirky Spatzendreck dessert wine, are just two of the other favourites that have helped to turn Delheim into a household name.

A holistic approach to community and land, to winemaking and to enduring good business practices are what sustain Delheim. The aim has always been to nurture a strong culture of sustainable development on the farm and within the surrounding community that works together on the Delheim estate.

### All about that orange.

The first wheat beers were incredibly sour, at least until Belgian monks began experimenting with dried orange peel and coriander from the Curaçao. Since then, the bright and fragrant flavour of orange peel has been a mainstay ingredient in Hoegaarden.

### Yes, really. Coriander.

# **OMO VALLEY:** EMPHATICALLY BREATHTAKING

I recently visited the Omo Valley of southern Ethiopia to photograph and learn more about the various cultures of the region.



he Omo Valley is a place like no other. It is spectacularly diverse in terms of ecosystems, cultures and language. The area is a cultural melting pot with at least 16 distinct ethnic groups who have managed to retain their traditional lifestyle. The harsh environment makes it undesirable to outsiders as it is mostly dry, inhospitable and extreme, thereby preserving its unique local ethnic communities.

My journey in the Omo Valley was a phenomenal experience. We spent time with 7 different ethnic groups and learnt that each group has unique and individual traditions. The trip was life-enriching and the images I captured are like no others I have taken. Each day presented a different interaction and opportunity to the previous day. My photographs grew in depth and meaning and each has a fascinating story of tradition and custom. As a photographer, I grew and developed as I became more enthralled by the knowledge about each group's history and traditions. Here are two of the clans that I found really fascinating:

### Mursi

The most well known ethnic group, the Mursi, live a predominately pastoral lifestyle. Today, the Mursi population is approximately 7 500 and they are famed for their lower lip plate. About 6 - 12 months before marriage (usually between 15 and 18 years old), a young woman has her lip pierced by her mother or a kinswoman. The initial piercing consists of an incision in the lower lip of around 1 - 2cm and a small wooden peg is inserted. After the wound heals, the peg is replaced by a slightly bigger peg and, once the incision is at 4cm, the first lip plate is inserted. Every woman crafts her own plate from clay and takes pride in its decoration. The final diameter ranges from 8cm to 20cm.

Scarification is also practised. Scars are usually made with a razor blade and dirt is rubbed into the wound to make the scar stand out. The Mursi tribe also

wears a lot of metal armbands, bracelets and anklets and on special occasions will adorn themselves with headdresses, animal skins and warthog tusks.

### Dassanech

The Dassanech people are the most southerly group in the Omo Valley. Over time, the ethnic group has absorbed many different people and can be divided into approximately eight clans, each with its own customs. The Dassanech population is around 47 500.

Both men and women adorn themselves with beads and bracelets and wear clothes made from leather. Men often carry a small wooden stool to sit on. Both Dassanech men and women are circumcised as a pre-requisite for marriage. Boys undergo circumcision together in temporary huts built for

the occasion, whilst girls are circumcised around 10 - 12 years of age, normally in a mother's house, with girls of the same age participating in the same ritual. Once the



ritual is completed, the girl wears a necklace given to her by her mother and a leather skirt. She is now considered an adult and marriage usually takes place shortly thereafter.

# AN HOUR IN KRUGER

We were booked into Tamboti Tented Camp, a five minute drive inside Kruger Park's central entry point, Orpen Gate.

he safari tents, set on platforms head-high above the ground, range from being quite basic to large – large includes a kitchen and dining area on the platform.

The tents, each out of sight of the others, overlook the wide but usually dry N'waswitsontso River. We found a set of recent elephant footprints coming straight across the river to within a few metres of our dining corner but an electrified fence had intervened.

A spotted genet arrived at dinner time and although it came no nearer than 3 metres from our table it plainly expected to be fed. There's a R500 fine for feeding wildlife which is tough on women because they are hardwired to feed any animal that looks at them. I suggested Mary found a mouse or small bird to feed it – genets love them – but my suggestion was met with narrowed eyes.

Next morning our breakfast companion was a tree squirrel that also kept its distance but was also hopeful of a hand-out. Unlike the genet, it's a vegetarian though it doesn't mind an insect or two.


On our last day in the park we set off at 6am but on an expedition outside the park. We decided to spend the morning driving back the way we had come two days before – back along the Mashishing (Lydenburg) road as far as the JG Strijdom Tunnel next to the market stalls.

This was because, while at Tamboti, we heard that a Taita Falcon – arguably South Africa's rarest bird – was in residence at the tunnel. It was too good an opportunity to miss. I'd had a very unsatisfactory siting a year before and, for Mary, a member of that exclusive fraternity whose members have positively identified over 700 South African bird species, the Taita would be a lifer.

Via her phone she had arranged a meeting with Michael Kumako who runs a souvenir stall at the tunnel and

who's an authority on the falcon. And there he was, waiting at the side of the road with a scope on a tripod. The scope was lined up ready for us and, at a neck-craning height, there sat the elusive predator.

Taitas sit on cliff ledges waiting for birds, even a fast-flying swift, to skim past whereupon they dive after it at a speed that must approach 200km/h and pluck it from the air. A great example of fast food.

I bought one of Michael's hand-crafted dishes bearing his really excellent hand-painted likeness of the bird. He sells them at R200 but "only to people who have positively identified the falcon". So this, for me, is something of a trophy.

But what a wonderful way to earn an honest living and it is thanks to Birdlife Africa which bought Michael the scope and to the Endangered Wildlife Trust whose Environmental Education Awareness scheme trained him as a nature guide and, in particular, bird guide. He has identified more than 40 species near the tunnel entrance.

The Taita disappeared for four years. "It was awful," said Michael whose income dropped to almost nil.

The escapade left us with only four hours back inside the park for we were due in Hazyview late in the afternoon. Once back inside, we were driving along the Orpen/Satara road when we were flagged down and told of a kill along the S36. The turn-off was two minutes ahead to our right. We had just enough time – one hour in fact – for a brief excursion down the S36.

It's amazing what we saw in that hour.

The kill turned out to be a few days old; the wreckage of a full-grown buffalo lying next to a fallen tree trunk along which sat several hunched-up whitebacked vultures looking like a row of morbid rubbernecks. Several hyenas were crunching away at the rib cage while two black-backed jackals darted in and out snatching what they could.

We drove a little further along to the Muzandzeni picnic spot where we were rewarded by seeing a Scops-owl asleep in a tree. We turned back, stopping again at the carcass and noting how quickly the hyenas had chewed down each of the main ribs that looked as tough as car springs.

We were about to drive off when, from over a low rise behind the kill, a four-

ton elephant materialised and began hurrying towards us. It appeared to be fleeing from something. Seconds later, a dozen more elephants and small calves followed – all running. They crossed the road just ahead of us.

It was only then we realised they were making a beeline for a sunken pool to our left and into it they tumbled just like a joyous family on a hot afternoon: splashing and drinking and dousing themselves with water.

Minutes later we came across two giraffe totally relaxed, sitting on their haunches – a sight one rarely sees.

We also noted, within that allotted hour, buffalo, kudu, duiker, impala, steenbok and zebra.

very easy to navigate. Bluetooth is also standard but you will have to pay extra for features such as Apple Car Play/Android Auto, sunroof, dual-zone climate control, reverse camera, virtual cockpit and LED lights, and leather seats to name a few.

When driving, the Q2 comes into a world of its own. Its raised ride height allows for a higher drive whereby you'll be looking down on the other hatchbacks on the road. The drive feels safe, solid and confidence-inspiring. In fact, if you decide to take the Q2 for a spirited drive through some corners, the sporty characteristics and road manners of the car will surprise you.

There are 2 engines to choose from, both being turbocharged – the 1.0TFSI and the 1.4TFSI. The 1.0TFSI is good enough to get you around town in a relaxed fashion with relatively low fuel consumption - under 7.0I/100km, but it is the 1.4TFSI that is the pick of the two. With over 90kW and over 200Nm, it makes overtaking and accelerating a breeze and, if you are after a sporty experience, it is definitely the engine to go for.

# TO SNIP OR NOT.

Despite vets strongly recommending routine sterilisation, there still seems to be some misinformation regarding the spaying and neutering of dogs and cats, leaving some pet parents confused and uncertain.



ven those of you who have shared your homes with
 sterilised pets before may find there are some things you
 didn't know about the process of sterilisation.

## MEDICAL BENEFITS

Sterilisation of dogs and cats is performed, **not only to prevent unwanted litters, but because it is proven to eliminate various types of cancers** and to reduce other diseases that are regularly seen in intact (unsterilised) pets. Intact females are automatically predisposed to the development of **mammary, uterine and ovarian cancers** with every heat that they experience. These cancers are very difficult to treat and often spread to other organs.

Also, any intact female that doesn't give birth has a high risk of developing **a particularly nasty condition called pyometra**. This is pretty much a rotting womb, filled with pus that will eventually rupture and cause a life-threatening peritonitis and septicaemia. Pricey emergency surgery and a long recovery period would be the only chance of saving her life. These conditions are totally preventable through early sterilisation.

For intact males, prostate and testicular cancers are prevalent. Both conditions are problematic and potentially fatal.

Additionally, intact dogs and cats tend to wander long distances in order to find mates. This places them at risk of being hit by cars, injured in fights with other animals and contracting diseases spread through fighting.

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# Sterilised pets live longer, healthier lives.

## **BEHAVIOURAL BENEFITS**

Many unwanted behaviours in a pet, such as increased territorial aggression, dominance, frequent urine marking, escapism and wandering are effectively addressed in male dogs and cats through neutering, as these behaviours are driven by their testosterone levels, which are reduced by the operation.

Sterilisation will not fix all dominance and aggression problems in pets, as not all of them are hormone-related. If you struggle with a bolshie pet, sterilise it for all the other important reasons, but speak to your vet and/or a behaviourist to assist you with the specific behavioural issues.

One of the most common questions we hear from clients regarding sterilisation is, "Won't it change his/her personality?"

Spaying or neutering a dog will not change its intrinsic personality, its affectionate behaviour, playfulness, ability to learn, nor its protective instincts towards you and your family. It simply stops the unwanted behaviour, like continual urine marking inside and outside the house, territorial fights, or hitting the canine or feline "dating scene" going on beyond your walls.

Sterilised cats are noticeably more affectionate than their intact counterparts, are happier to remain close to home and form social bonds with the other pets sharing their space.

## SOCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Owning intact animals can be incredibly disruptive. Female cats (called queens) are very "yowly" and unruly when they're in season (something that occurs every 3 weeks in spring and summer) and female dogs (called... well, we all know what they're called and this is a family magazine, so we're not going to print it) are on heat for 3 weeks each season, with two seasons a year and are often more aggressive during this time.

There are products available which are the doggy equivalent of sanitary pads, to manage the blood spotting, but these are neither practical, nor easy to use. Of more concern is the fact that **the scent** of a female on heat can be picked up by intact males from several kilometres away, and they will literally do anything to get to her. Procreating is, after all, a survival instinct. This all too often leads to animals being injured while running around the streets or trying to squeeze under gates or fighting each other for "the prize".

The responsible thing to do if you own a female on heat is to kennel her for the entire heat period, in the interests of not causing utter mayhem amongst the other pets in your neighbourhood. If owners choose not to do this due to the expense, or do not want to be separated from their pet for several weeks, keeping her safely locked away becomes imperative. Male dogs and cats can be very persistent when it comes to "chasing tail". If only we had a Rand for every time someone has proudly announced that they will carefully keep their girl separated from all potential suitors, only to be surprised 63 days later by a litter of adorable furry

Unlike human beings and primates, dogs and cats do not engage in the sexual act outside of the mating period, as it is not a recreational activity. It is a purely biological act, governed by cyclical hormonal processes, and serves only to further the species. Sterilised animals have no hormonal drive to mate and therefore simply don't.

This should not be confused with "humping" behaviour, which may be demonstrated by female and male dogs towards another animal, or an inanimate object, as a sign of social dominance. It serves no sexual purpose and occurs when that pet feels displaced in the group hierarchy of the family and attempts to dominate those he/she feels should be subservient by mounting them. Humping furniture, blankets, or clothing, especially

in cats, may be a self-comforting behaviour, much like a toddler sucking their thumb, and is often seen in handraised cats.

# WHAT EXACTLY IS INVOLVED IN THE STERILISATION OPERATION?

In the neutering of males, the testicles are removed from the scrotum, so that sperm can no longer be produced or released. Spaying of females involves a full hysterectomy, where the womb and ovaries are removed.

Specific post-op care of your pet is important:

• The care of the sterilisation wound involves keeping a close eye on the area to ensure that it stays clean and dry, does not become swollen and that your pet does not interfere with the stitches. Cats, particularly, are guilty of the latter, and an Elizabethan collar (a.k.a "the cone of shame") or other barrier may need to be put in place to prevent them from pulling out their stitches.

- Stitches will need to be removed by your veterinarian or vet nurse 10 - 14 days after the operation, or as directed.
- Females should be kept confined for at least 7 days after the operation and prevented from jumping, climbing and running, to avoid damaging their internal stitches and causing a hernia.
- Painkillers will be sent home with your pet after the op, to reduce discomfort. They may not want to eat on the evening of Operation Day, but should be eating normally by the next morning.

Dogs and cats are hard-wired to heal as quickly as possible from any injury as in the wild, their survival depends on fending for themselves. Both sterilised male and female pets may be a bit sore and subdued for a day after the op but thereafter you will struggle to keep them calm in order to heal, as they'll be back to their normal rambunctious selves in no time.



# WHAT'S THE BESTAGE TO STERILISE MY PET?

Pets should be sterilised at 6 months, before they reach sexual maturity. Welfare organisations perform the operation at a much younger age, without side-effects, as they are unable to otherwise guarantee that the pet will be sterilised after rehoming.

# CAN THE FEMALE BE SPAYED WHILE SHE'S ON HEAT?

While it is possible to sterilise female animals while they're on heat, the procedure is much more complex and carries a bit more risk. There is a heavier blood supply to the reproductive organs when a female is in season, resulting in more blood loss during the operation. It's advisable to sterilise pets before they come into heat, or to wait until they have finished their heat.

If your pet is in season when she's spayed, you will need to ensure that she is <u>strictly</u> separated from males until her stitches have been removed. She will still be giving off attractive pheromones and, if she is mounted during this period, there is a risk of internal stitches being dislodged, resulting in life-threatening internal bleeding.

# WHAT DO I DO IF MY PET BECOMES PREGNANT?

There are two options - the pet may be sterilised as early as possible during the pregnancy (ie. the pups or kittens will be aborted), or you commit to the proper supportive care of your girl during her pregnancy and to finding good homes for her babies. If your pet has become

pregnant and the litter is not a purebred one, please consider how many mixedbreed dogs and cats are already desperate for homes, before adding another litter to the number.

Bear in mind that some of the larger dog breeds may have as many as 16 pups, which means you'll need to find homes for all of them! Also, some breeds, like the English Bulldog, are often physically incapable of giving natural birth due to their body shape, so they require a caesarean section. Raising a litter of puppies or kittens, even with their mother's help, is time consuming and a financially intensive event. Before homing the new pups or kittens, they will also need to be dewormed and have their first vaccination. So pet pregnancy can be expensive and prevention is preferable!!

Both dogs and cats are pregnant on average for 63 days from conception. With regards to feeding during the pregnancy - for the first 2 trimesters, dogs and cats can be fed their regular diet. In their last trimester, they should have free access to a full bowl of **a balanced diet high in protein and fat**. For dogs, that would be either a small/medium



breed puppy food or a high-performance diet for working dogs. Cats should be allowed ad lib feeding on a kitten diet or a specific mother and baby product. Twisted Whiskers' recommendations for dogs are - Eukanuba Premium Performance, Hills Performance, Royal Canin Mother & Babydog. For cats we suggest Royal Canin Mother & Babycat, Hills Kitten or lams Kitten.

## WILL MY CAT OR DOG GET FAT AFTER STERILISATION?

The ONLY drawback of the sterilisation operation is that it can slow down the metabolism in both cats and dogs. BUT, this is in no way a reason not to sterilise: not all breeds are equally affected and with **the correct changes to your pet's** 



portion sizes and/or type of food, they will maintain a lovely lean figure post op. Twisted Whiskers staff or a member of your veterinary healthcare team will happily advise you on exactly what changes to make.

# IS STERILISATION A RISKY PROCEDURE?

Any surgical procedure carries risks, and sterilisation is no different. However, spaying and neutering are the most common and routine operations performed by veterinarians, with few complications.

Unless you are a registered breeder who has thoroughly researched your breed, are committed to ethical breeding practices and accountable to the relevant breed organisations, there really is no reason to keep your pet intact. The benefits of sterilisation are multiple and the cons, virtually non-existent. Our advice:




