I should never have asked them in the first place. In fact forget the whole thing.





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

## INCREASE IN BROAD LEAF WEEDS

As this time of the year comes around there tends to be an increase in broad leaf weeds in our lawns.

Below is some information and tips on how to control these troubling weeds.

#### What are Broadleaf Weeds?

The term "Broadleaf Weeds" refers to a very large number of very different weed types that all fit into a similar pattern of having mostly broad leafs, as well as being treatable by the same type of herbicide.

Broadleaf weeds can include many wild grasses, clover, bindii, catsear, dandelions and hundreds if not thousands of other weed types.

### What is your first treatment option?

Broadleaf Weed Killers Because the category of broadleaf weeds is so varied and immense in size, it is often the first type of herbicide to turn to when there is multiple or unknown weed types in home lawns. A spray with a broadleaf herbicide will usually kill many weeds in its first application, leaving only more specific weed types that can then be most easily be identified and treated.

#### Applying Broadleaf Weed Killers

There are many different brands of broadleaf herbicides available and they are all very similar in their applications. They can be bought from most nurseries in a concentrated form and mixed up in spraying bottles as per manufacturer's directions.

Spraying the lawn is very straight forward, with the homeowner only keeping these points in mind when planning on spraying:

Never spray one week prior to, or after, lawn mowing. This allows the grass to heal its wounds from mowing, and if it wasn't done then the lawn would absorb much of the chemical that are being applied to it, thus killing the lawn.

Never water your lawn for several days after the application of broadleaf herbicides. The longer the lawn can go without a drink, the better, as this will allow as much herbicide as possible to penetrate the weed before any residual is washed away from watering. **Buffalo Lawns and Broad Leaf Weeds** Buffalo lawns are extremely sensitive to broadleaf weed sprays, this is because the same principle the herbicide uses to attach itself to the broad leaf of these weeds, also attaches itself to the broad leaf of Buffalo grass. The result can be the sickness or even death of the lawn.


Some broadleaf herbicides are suitable for use with Buffalo lawns, so always be very careful before choosing the right herbicide and always check the label as to it's suitability for use on Buffalo grass prior to purchase.

#### Weed and Feed Herbicides

These herbicides are the ones which are usually attached to a garden hose and sprayed onto the lawn to kill off weeds. They are almost always broadleaf herbicides and mostly will adversely affect Buffalo lawns. They are very weak and of very little benefit, and generally should be avoided at all times, a good concentrated broadleaf herbicide should be purchased instead, it is easily mixed in a sprayer and will provide far greater results than any weed and feed ever will.

Hopefully these few tips will be helpful to any homeowner who has broad leaf weeds in their lawns.



All in all it was a super day that was only cut a few minutes short by Mother Nature with the glorious rain that was much needed.



Add in the endless supply of Christmas treats, general present excitement, Father Christmas anticipation, and times with extended family, and you've got a recipe for one grumpy, hyped-up child. But don't be afraid – it is possible to survive this time of twinkling lights while enjoying the festive fun for yourself and your family. Just follow these simple steps, and you'll make it to the New Year with your Christmas spirit intact.

#### Rein it in

Maybe this is the first Christmas your little one really gets the whole idea or maybe you have an experienced 8 year old ready to negotiate her wish list with Father Christmas, but managing their expectations is a big part of keeping your children happy this time of year. You can have conversations about what's reasonable for a present list, exactly how many treats you'll allow at the Estate Christmas party, and why bedtime is still important on Christmas Eve. having it in a central location in the house for everyone to enjoy. A table top tree is also an option. Keep the tree away from the edges and watch out for dangling tree skirts and light cords so little hands can't pull the tree down on top of little heads.

For families who have lots of littlies toddling around year after year, a child-proof tree may be the answer. Use fishing line to anchor the tree to the ceiling. Non-breakable ornaments (homemade ornaments are great alternatives) tied to the tree with ribbons instead of metal hooks (choking hazard!) are the solution to your smallest little pickle who loves to crawl under the Christmas tree and lie looking up at the sparkling lights from underneath.

#### **Silent Night**

Probably the most difficult thing to do during the holidays is slow down, but find ways to take a break or a breather or just let stuff go where you can. You can start a family tradition of spending Christmas Eve in your pj's playing a board game or singing carols together. If you don't have to go anywhere on Christmas morning, save time for the kids to actually play with their presents, or spread out when you open things so instead of a confusing flurry of wrapping paper and bows you can open and appreciate a few things throughout the day. Most toddlers are easily distracted, so they'll be more likely to remember the presents you chose with such care if they're doled out slowly.

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#### Let It Go!

You'll feel a lot better about holiday upsets and schedule changes if you can let go of the idea of controlling everything. Your aunts and uncles won't care if you took a little holiday cooking help from the prepared foods aisle. And your kids won't care if their presents aren't wrapped like a Pinterest project. Sure, the baby may throw a fit right during your 6 year old's Christmas play, but in a week or so the incident will just be a funny story you can tell. What's important is spending time together, appreciating the love you share. The small ones in your life won't be small forever, so make sure you take time to appreciate them in all their messy, grumpy, sugared-up glory!

# FUN GAMES TO PLAY IN THE CAP

The time to leave for holiday has eventually arrived! The kids are simply bursting with excitement and mom and dad can't wait to unwind and enjoy the desperately needed holiday.

But in between driving out of the driveway and getting to your holiday destination is a gaping, scarily long journey that could turn into a nightmare if the kids get bored and cranky. If you've travelled a long way with kids before, you'll know that you're hardly out of your suburb when they first ask the dreaded question: "Are we nearly there?"

You might have brought along the electronic games, laptops, tablets and DVD players, but even if you do have these devices, you'll find that children get bored with them in no time and want human interaction.

Playing a game in the car is a great family activity and many games are educational too, developing vocabulary, memory and spelling and maths. Make some happy memories of road trips by playing one of the fun games below.

#### AI PHABET GAME

Our family loves to play this game when we're driving. It's extremely simple and goes like this: you choose a category, such as animals, and then everyone has a turn to name ananimal that begins with 'A', for example. It's some times better to let the youngest player have his or her turn first so that all the easy options aren't taken by the time it's their turn.

Other categories could be makes of car, countries, plant names, sports ... whatever you can think of!

## **I SPY**

This must be one of the games most played in cars! Player One looks around and chooses an item he can see. He says: I spy with my little eye something beginning with A (or whatever the first letter of the item).

The other players then have a certain numbers of tries to guess the item. Whoever guesses correctly wins and it's his turn to "I spy..." If nobody gets it right, the player has another turn.

### GEOGRAPHY

This is another favourite. Simply say the name of a place – such as a country, province or river- and the next player responds by naming a place that begins with the letter with which your place ended. For instance, if Player One says "Johannesburg", Player Two must choose a place name that starts with "G", such as Germany. You can make it harder for older players by restricting the names to a particular area. For example, only places in South Africa or in Gauteng.

## ANAGRAMS

Take along a white board and you can have fun unscrambling words. One person thinks of a five or six letter word, such as P-U-N-C-H, and jumbles up the letters, for example C-U-P-N-H. Another player has to figure out the word.

#### LICENCE PLATE DOUBLES See how many doubles (two of the same letter or number together) you can spot. The person who gets the most wins.

### 20 QUESTIONS

One player thinks of an animal, plant or object and the other players are given a total of 20 "yes" or "no" questions to guess the player's item. The game usually begins by narrowing down whether the item is an animal, vegetable or mineral; for instance, you could ask "Is it an animal?" Other good questions can relate to size, such as whether the item is larger than a bread box, or location ( for example "Would you find it in a kitchen?"). Any of your 20 questions can be a guess. If you do not correctly identify the item after 20 questions, one free bonus guess is permitted.

## SPOT YOUR CAR

Choose a model of car, for example a Ford Fiesta. See how many you can spot in a certain amount of time. Make it more difficult by specifying the colour of the car.

## How to make:

#### Christmas snowman

- Roll 2 different sized balls of white fondant (one the size of a small marble and the other the size of a large marble).
- Place the 2 balls on top of each other to form the head and the body of the snowman.
- Imprint the 2 eyes with a toothpick and form a bigger hole for the nose.
- 4. To make the nose, roll a small ball of orange fondant paste into a teardrop shape, but with 2 ends (one point to be inserted into the hole and the other to form the 'carrot' nose.
- Roll a thin sausage in purple fondant to wrap around the head for the scarf.
- 6. For the hat, roll a ball of dark brown fondant into a ball and flatten the ball for the rim of the hat and roll a bigger ball into a sausage with flat ends to form the top of the hat.

#### Christmas tree

- Roll a large ball of bright green fondant into a teardrop shape. Insert a toothpick at the base for easier handling - the point of the teardrop to face upwards.
- Using a small sharp scissor, start at the top and, pointing the scissor upwards at an angle, cut small incisions to form the tree spikes. Continue around the teardrop to the base at the bottom.
- Roll small balls of different coloured fondant for decorations.

\*Any decorations can be added on the tree as decorations, tinsel, stars, angels, etc.



#### Notes:

- Secure all the different parts of the figurines with edible glue (available at most good baking shops – it can also be known as sticky stuff (Rolkern).
- Fondant paste: 100g Fondant : 5ml Tylose /CMC powder
- When colouring fondant paste, please keep in mind that the colour develops darker overnight, so it is always better to colour your fondant a day or two in advance before making the figurines.
- Always wash your hands in between using different colours of fondant (especially when working with dark colours) as the paste can stain your hands and be transferred to the other colours.

## "PORTUGAL – A RHAPSODY IN BLUE"

Our plan for yet another of our cycle rides in Europe was to cycle south from Lisbon and follow Portugal's Blue Coast until we reached the second most westerly point in Europe – the most westerly being quite near where we were at, northwest of Lisbon.

e chose Portugal for our seventh annual ride because the Atlantic coast is the sunniest and warmest stretch of Europe's coastline and had few hills. And partly because we like grilled sardines and Portugal is very good at grilling them. And also because Portugal is not very expensive. Oh yes, and partly because we would be accompanied by a little yellow bus filled with drinks and sandwiches, Band-Aid and cycle repair kits. We'd booked through a cycling company, Cycling Through the Centuries, which, the year before, had accompanied us through Andalusia.

At home we went into training, eating sardines and drinking Periquita.

We spent our first night in Sintra, a short drive north of Lisbon. It's an enchanting Romanesque town – a World Heritage Site - where a lot of writers and artists live. Grand houses are scattered among the deeply forested Sintra Mountains - a landscape sculpted by violent earthquakes. The last violent quake was a mere 261 years ago which, in geological time is like yesterday last night. It destroyed Lisbon and wrecked towns down the Blue Coast.

From Sintra we set off south in the yellow bus that took us through Lisbon to the Hotel Club d'Azeitão, a magnificently restored manor house set among fields and vineyards where our hired bikes were waiting for a dawn departure.

Our route began by taking us away from the coast and up a rise before descending into the fishing village of Sesimbra famous for its restaurants and Muscadel wine - just in time for lunch. We lunched at the Pedra Alto on chopped octopus tentacles, large clams and grilled fish - wonderful Portuguese fare. We needed the kilojoules.

Then it was down the coast to the

minor port of Setúbal on the huge estuary of the River Sado. Setúbal was an important Roman port until a tsunami destroyed it. It is interesting how many catastrophic natural events have devastated Portugal's coastline.

Our rather cramped 4-star hotel, Albergaria Solaris, was literally sheathed in azulejos - the decorated glazed blue tiles so favoured by the Portguese, who adopted the art from the Moors who once occupied this region.

We sat in brilliant sunshine looking out at the sea and eating vast quantities of perfectly grilled sardines. By eating a lot and cycling a lot we were getting neither fitter nor fatter.

Next day we had a long kilojouleshedding ride to Santiago do Cacem down the coast passing through a onestreet village, Comporta. Its chimneys had raised platforms for the storks to nest on. It was good seeing so many young birds for stork numbers have been declining in Europe. The air was filled with the clattering of stork bills.

We cycled through a sunbleached, semi-arid landscape along a road bordered by shining mesambrianthimums and black-eyed susans and other semi-desert species – a bit like the Karoo by the sea.

Jimmy filled his water bottle with Coke. An hour later, forgetting he'd replaced the water, he emptied the bottle over his head. (When one is over 70 these things happen.)

Much of the route had a dedicated cycle lane. The Blue Coast's charm is that it is quiet and unspoiled with many secluded coves. Its rolling farmlands go right down to the sea.

Our next B&B was in a small valley and hidden by giant trees – a former manor house, the Pousada Quinta do Ortiga. A pousada being an inn. We crossed a courtyard of marble cobbles to reach its impressive entrance and found our upstairs rooms to be spacious, each having a balcony looking down on what used to be a farmyard.

Exploring the grounds at dawn I came across a large swimming pool whose sheltering walls were richly decorated with azulejos. Many Portuguese believe, as did the Moors, that blue tiles ward off evil spirits. Many white-washed cottages that we passed had their windows framed in blue.

We used the bus for a 40km detour to the 2 200-year-old extensive Roman settlement of Mirobriga that had an incredibly advanced and still largely intact thermal bathhouse with basement furnaces and central heating. Its hippodrome, for chariot racing, sat 25 000 spectators. The forum and even Quaint Blue Home

a shopping street were preserved.

The 70km route to Villa Nova de Milfontes was easy cycling. The small town had a village atmosphere and a jumble of ancient buildings at its centre. This is where the Rio Mira meets the sea and where Hannibal once sought shelter for his ships – Hannibal, the Carpathian general whose army crossed the Alps with elephants greatly surprising the Romans.

Here we spent two nights in a moated castle and I was given the room at the top of Turret Number One from where I could watch out for Moorish invaders.

We spent a day cycling in a wide loop looking at the sort of windmills that turned on Don Quixote with rolling countryside on either side.

Next day an 80km ride took us to the "corner" of the Iberian peninsula where we had the choice of turning abruptly east or falling off the edge of Europe into the sea. This was the Algarve so beloved by sun-starved English tourists.

There were now more and impressive historical sites and reminders that Portugal produced some of the most adventurous people on earth. Four centuries ago this corner of Iberia produced many brilliant navigators who explored and helped develop several parts of the world. Their language is today the lingua franca of Brazil, Mozambique, Angola and parts of the Far East. Portugal retired from seafaring long ago to become Europe's quiet, bucolic uncle respected by all for having been there and done that. The Algarve provided leisurely cycling on smooth, safe roads but with scope for stronger cyclists to choose their own more challenging deviations. Lots of amateur cyclists would welcome this but we were, after all, professionals who didn't need challenges and preferred grilled sardines.

We were now very near the epicentre of the catastrophic 1755 earthquake that destroyed most towns along the coast. Lisbon itself was laid to waste. It was, I imagine, the worst natural disaster to hit western Europe since Vesuvius buried Pompeii in AD 79, and so recent.

The earthquake, caused by the Africa plate pressing up against southern Europe, was on All Saints Day when the cathedrals and churches were full. They collapsed on top of their congregations.

This seventh expedition remains the most tranquil and leisurely of all our sorties into Europe.

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

## **PROACTIVE PARENTING:** THE IMPORTANCE OF PARENTS AS ROLE MODELS

When you hear someone say, "Your child is a miniyou" or "The apple doesn't fall far from the tree" or "Like father, like son" – doesn't that make you feel so proud? But, have you ever really thought, as a parent, about your impact as a role model, in your children's lives?



applies to other substances such as alcohol or drugs and, even to domestic abuse – these are cycles that tend to repeat themselves from one generation to the next. Sadly too, parents with low self-esteem, often raise children with low self-esteem.

On the flip-side, children who come from happy homes tend to be happy adults; when they are exposed to love, care and support growing up they tend to demonstrate those same characteristics towards others.

### **Role modelling**

By definition, a role model is a person whose behaviour, example and success others admire and then want to emulate. From a very young age, our children do just that, they take their cues from us, watching our every move. Whether it be through direct interactions with us, or observing how we conduct ourselves, how we behave in certain situations, how we deal with stress or anxiety, and even how we love and treat those around them. Our children learn from our examples and are very likely to follow in our footsteps. And role models aren't just parents - they can be any significant adults in your children's lives. That is something to be aware of especially if that person doesn't share your value system and you don't want them influencing your children directly.

### Why is this so important?

We all want to raise well-adjusted children we can be proud of and, as they reach the teen years, that they are young people with the ability to make good decisions in the face of many challenges and temptations. As parents we can directly influence this and as our children grow, our roles as parents also

change, all the while presenting opportunity to integrate learning activities. It is really vital that we are aware and cognisant of the influence we can be having on our children's perceptions of acceptable and appropriate behaviour.

But, we also know it is impossible to be perfect all the time and in fact, it's totally unrealistic. Allowing our children to see that parents and adults are also human, and flawed and can make mistakes is really important. In these situations, how we deal with difficulties and how we recover, is the real life lesson.

Be as aware as possible, in the presence of your children, of how you deal with disappointment or anger, the way you treat others in terms of honesty or respect, tolerance and kindness and perhaps even the way you socialise (how much you drink, smoke or swear and behave). These are all aspects which can fundamentally affect the young people you are raising.

## Positive outcomes

Day-to-day situations make for wonderful active learning opportunities. These suggestions might be valuable to consider:

- Show your child how to behave there is no better way! Walk your talk and lead by example!
- Discipline yourself especially

when children are around. That's a tough one but it's a reality. We can't really expect our children to stay off their devices and communicate with us when we don't do it ourselves. How often does your child try to get your attention but you are busy replying to messages or are on Facebook?

- When it comes to decision-making, include your children in the discussion. Let them observe how you and your spouse discuss things and make decisions. If appropriate, you can even ask them what they think and guide them in this.
- Be aware of what you say, especially in a more volatile situation. Try to control your anger and aggression.
   According to experts at the KidsHealth website, children who display aggressive behaviour often learnt this from their role models in the home environment.
- With matters relating to tolerance, respect and kindness, they can learn those skills simply from the way you treat them and each other in the home. Do try to demonstrate this outside of the home – so that they know that other people also matter.
- Actively decide on the positive aspects of life you would like to role model for your family. This

could be diligence, happiness, compassion, patience, respect and even self-respect. You could consider monthly themes for the whole family to participate in, to actively encourage thinking about behaviour and its impact. • Live with positivity – it can be very

energising.

So, despite the fact that our children may mimic some of our less-thanfavourable traits, good parenting can go a very long way. It's up to us as parents to break any negative cycles that may exist within our families and to raise strong, resilient children through effective parent role modelling.

Maybe this can be the real gift you give your children this upcoming year – the gift of good role models with sound values and positive behavioural traits. You can actually shape your children's behaviour in doing so.
