his being the last quarter of 2015, it is evident that the social calendars are filling up and the weather warming up nicely! It seems that spring was skipped this year as the Estate is already showing off its summer colours and beauty.

It is with pleasure that I congratulate Elizabeth de Kock as our first Chairlady of Fourways Gardens Estate. Despite her petite frame, she appears to be filling very big shoes with great ease. The board of directors have settled into their new portfolios and

under the guidance and with the support of Elizabeth (Liz) and the newly appointed board, the HOA team has compiled a clear list of priorities that we would like to achieve before the next AGM. As with all building projects, our vegetation did take a bit of strain, but this will be rectified and improved under the guidance of our experienced environmental director, Johan Barnard. Johan's years of experience in landscape design has made him an invaluable part of this board and I am sure that our residents are not aware of the extent of the benefit he is already adding to the Estate. Johan has also joined up with the Aesthetics Committee, which

is being led by Charles Schneider, to ensure that the objective of this committee is being carried out in a practical manner.

Another project that was overdue has also been completed. Our turnstiles at both pedestrian entrances were dilapidated and caused many maintenance headaches over the past couple of years. With the assistance of Stephen Beuthner, the security director, this project has been completed and will provide smooth functionality to our security-vetted pedestrians. Stephen has also been the driving force behind the fibre to the home project. What started as a security necessity, namely fibre link between the Estate office and the security control room at the gates, ended in a project that should put Fourways Gardens Estate in a leading position with regards

to connectivity. This will also do no harm to your property value.



I would like to leave you with the wise words of Madiba:



GPS MONITORING

hilst many people are fast asleep in their beds cosy and warm in the middle of the night the award winning patroller team from the security department is operating throughout the streets of the Estate. This industrious team patrols every metre of roadway in

the Estate every night of every day of the year. As can be imagined weather conditions out in the street are not always optimal, however these men are on their station no matter what. The officers are assisted in their momentous task by the Bloodhound Patrol System or affectionately known as the "Bloodhound".

The Bloodhound Patrol System is a GPS live monitoring system that is custom suited to the Estate's specific requirements. Each officer is monitored by the onsite control room and individual officers can be pinpointed to within one metre of the officer's location at any time whilst on patrol. Naturally the real life applications of the system are nearly limitless from a monitoring stand point and from a safety aspect to the officers.

The need to monitor the productivity of one's guard force has and always will be in the forefront of security managers' minds. Fourways Gardens is no exception and making sure the officers are out on patrol is key to providing a professional service to our residents.

Bloodhound works with many of the leading local and international security-guarding companies to ensure operational compliance. For instance in South Africa, where security is a major consideration, Bloodhound is used by most, if not all, of the large guarding companies for patrols scheduling and monitoring, the execution of location-based checklists and the management of workflows and incident escalations.

Given the broad use of Bloodhound in the security industry, it is able to benchmark performance both within individual customers and across the industry. This allows us to help pinpoint key performance and productivity drivers and advise on how to adjust patrols to improve overall performance.

Bloodhound also plays a critical role in providing an objective measure of service delivery, helping to facilitate a proactive and productive relationship between the guard force and the Estate.

As mentioned earlier in this article, the FWG team of patrollers is the leading team of Bloodhound patrol teams in the country for 2014 and if our stats are anything to go by for this year we will be number 1 again this year.


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

- 1. **Body Image** spatial concepts. A child learns to relate his/her body to the space around him. A pre-requisite for learning to write and draw.
- Movement Skills Movement is a fundamental need for every child. Activities and skills programmes are necessary to develop balance and posture, gross and fine-motor coordination and bi-lateral integration.
- Language The basis of communication. Concept development, categorisation and receptive and expressive language.

NEW TRENDS & TIPS ON LANDSCAPING AND GARDENING

Shirley Wallington, well-known oracle in landscaping and frequent 702 and Classic FM radio broadcaster, addressed our Gardening Club at our meeting on 10 September.



he trend is to move away from the English country garden; it is trendy now to use hard landscaping, paving, decking and water features. Life is becoming more and more hectic and thus people have less time for gardening. The Grasses phase is over... the trend is now for large drifts of Watsonias and Agapanthus rather.

Lollipop trees are firmly OUT – the trend now is square hedges... Eugenia, for example, gets a haircut from ground level to waist level and is reshaped to a square floating hedge with plants underneath.

Colour is back in style – landscapers are playing with complementary colours like purple and yellow. Avoid clashes of orange and pink. When planning your garden update, don't be in a rush. Remember 80% of success in the garden is planning and preparation.

- Take your notebook and camera to the nursery and leave your purse at home. Research the plants that will work well in your garden: particularly their adult size, sun/shade and soil preferences.
- 2. Prepare the soil, using natural composts and fertilizer products.
- Water is crucial to successful gardening – get a storage tank and guttering/piping (see our article in last month's magazine or write to Francesca for a copy).
- 4. Make your plant selection exciting:

look for something different and special such as Wild Peach.

- At our Gardening Club we should share our plants such as Clematis, Crab Apple, Prunis – all unusual – Cobius Scandus vine with delicate flowers, Giant Watsonias and Iris nathia.
- Azaleas don't like competition with other plants or ground cover – they like to be alone. Plant Azalias together in pots of acid compost.
- 7. Clivias love to be in groups keep them in clumps and do not split.
- Lawns are hugely expensive and avid feeders: try to incorporate some hard landscaping – rocks, pebbles, grave, for example.

SHIRLEY'S GARDENING TIPS

- Take clematis cuttings using cinnamon or turmeric as a growth hormone.
- Through next winter take a cutting from a successful tomato bush and grow it in a bottle of water during winter. Come spring, plant it again for another harvest.
- For caterpillars on clivia or amaryllis use a 50/50 mix of baking soda and flour, alternatively use Johnsons baby powder.
- To fertilise roses use Epsom Salts.
- Use methylated spirits neat on woolly aphids or rose scale. Don't use on ferns.
- For aphids and most other pests, cook up a cocktail of onion, garlic and chilli/ cayenne pepper. Boil in 4 cups of water and then add some grated soap. Boil another 20 minutes. When cold, blend

the result and mix 1:10 with water and use as a spray.

- Leave a gallon of water with a peeled onion in it in the sun for three days – use the result to spray in the house to get rid of mosquitoes or insects.
- Slugs hate one part ammonia to 10 parts water.
- Snails put some beer in a yoghurt cup buried in the soil – they will die happy, but dispose of them into outside rubbish bin, not in compost.
- Get your gardener to pick up snail shells as they carry hosts of eggs in their shells.
- Aspirin in water is a great fertiliser for roses, fuschia and ferns.
- Coffee grounds are great for all plants as are old tea bags.
- Banana skins are good food for plants – dry them out and crush them.
- To rid weeds in the driveway, pour vinegar on them.
- If going away, soak newspaper in plenty of water in the bath and leave your indoor plant pots on top.
- Get an owl box in your garden to naturally rid it of mice and rats.
- Grow avocadoes and mangoes in pots

 they like good drainage, lots of sun, rich soil with nitrogen in spring and potassium in autumn.
- Plant basil with tomatoes they will be tastier.
- Plant chives with carrots, they will be sweeter.
- Plant marigolds with tomatoes and roses to keep pests away.
- Plant nasturtiums with squashes and broccoli, petunias with beans, oregano with cucumbers.
- Our many thanks to our Chairlady, Morag Vlaming, and her husband, Jan, for arranging Shirley's talk and for opening her home to our Club as the venue for the meeting.

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

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

PILANESBERG so near, so worth visiting

I might not have said this a few months ago but I will say it now with conviction: the Pilanesberg National Park, just two hours or so from Johannesburg, rates among South Africa's top five game reserves.

Hartebeest – one of many antelope species to be seen at the Pilanesberg National Park



visited it in August for the first time in many years. I had read from time to time how it had deteriorated. How the Pilanesberg Centre was tatty and offered dreadful food at high prices and how the souvenir shop was a rip off.

Its peripheral resorts such as Bakubung, Kwa Maritane and Manyane remained well run throughout and I've experienced all three.

I am not sure what happened at the reserve in the interim. All I can say is that the 500 square kilometre game reserve – it's bigger than Timbavati and bigger than Sabi Sand – is today one of Africa's jewels. Scenically it is a most attractive wildlife reserve, zoologically it is very rich indeed and, geologically, it is fascinating.

From space the Pilanesberg appears to be a spectacular circle – a vast

crater filled with hills, which is what it is. It is the geological wreckage of a cataclysmic event that began long before any life began on land. More than a billion years ago it was a volcano 7 000 metres high – far higher than Kilimanjaro, Africa's highest mountain.

Its outer wall – a rim of attractive hills – shields it like a fortress from the *middelveld* beyond.

Today it circles a beautiful landscape of rounded hills and natural rockeries blanketed by golden grass and a range of habitats making it suitable for a rich diversity of wildlife – at least 40 kinds of large mammals and 350 bird species.

In the not too distant future it will be linked by a contiguous group of conservancies all the way to Madikwe Game Reserve to the west on the Botswana border to form a 2 500sq km reserve. Pilanesberg National Park is not really a national park. It does not fall under the National Parks Board. It acquired its title only because it was part of the short-lived Republic of Bophuthatswana created for the Tswana people during the apartheid years. It is named after Chief Pilane, whose clan is still prominent in the region.

I was involved with Pilanesberg in its early stages. I first visited it when it was still farmland in the 1970s and I watched the farm fences come down and the farm buildings demolished. I saw the first animals arrive, although leopards, bushbuck, kudu, brown hyena and a few other species were there already. Lions, cheetah and wild dogs followed. By 1979 it was a proclaimed reserve – but there were problems galore.

Elephant and rhino were brought in. The elephants were young orphans – calves rescued after Kruger Park's



even at hides and picnic spots. And the Pilanesberg Centre with its cafés and souvenir shops are now clean and efficient.

We enjoyed cool drinks while watching a pageant of wildlife visiting the salt lick a few metres away. What a transformation from the early '80s when it was a cluster of municipal buildings surrounding a magistrate's court! All that remains is the 1930s court, which now houses the shops and cafés.

culling operations. They had not been subject to normal elephant community life, where discipline is strict. They were a bunch of hoodlums and they killed at least 40 white rhino before it was realised what was going on. Neither species had encountered the other before. The rhinos were from Zululand, where elephants were extinct; the elephants were from Kruger Park where rhinos were extinct. Lacking the required etiquette at waterholes, the rhinos failed to give way to elephants and were often tusked to death.

The young elephants were dangerous to humans as well. Only after mature elephants were brought in did the youngsters settle down.

It was Anton Rupert who initially raised the funds to fence Pilanesberg and there followed years of turning the clock back by allowing nature to take over. Walking in the reserve one comes across the

occasional relic. I have found blue glass medicine bottles dating back to the 19th century and the decaying foundations of farmsteads.

In the late 1980s, in a bush vehicle from nearby Sun City, I overheard an American woman and her husband reminding each other what they had seen that day. I surreptitiously jotted them down – elephant, white rhino, lion, cheetah, leopard, impala, kudu, waterbuck, wildebeest, and what was probably steenbok, porcupine, red hartebeest, zebra, giraffe, monkeys and baboons... it was as good a variety as one could hope to see anywhere in Africa..

Mary and I were there during the winter drought, nevertheless the big bird hides were worth visiting.

What impressed was the cleanliness of the well-equipped toilet facilities –

"Probably the main concern to any homeowner is the high cost of the initial outlay for such a system, which can cost as much as R300 000. But in the current climate of load-shedding, we probably do not have a choice in South Africa. Also, keep in mind that the immediate financial implications could be offset when the property is sold, as future buyers might be swayed by the advantages of purchasing solar powered homes. Your monthly electricity bill will be reduced by at least 50% so the system eventually pays for itself," shared Craig Hutchison, CEO of Engel & Völkers Southern Africa.

Starting a solar system for your home can be done in stages. For example, to start with the basic solar system



The solar panel converts sunlight into DC power or electricity to charge the battery. This DC electricity/(charge) is controlled via a solar regulator which ensures the battery is charged properly and not damaged and that power is not lost/(discharged). DC appliances can then be powered directly from the battery, but AC appliances need a power inverter to convert the DC electricity into 220 Volt AC power.

that will provide power for a TV, DVD, DStv, a radio and cellphone chargers and say 10 x 15W lights one would require:

- □ 4 x 80W solar panels
- □ 2 x 20A regulators
- □ 4 x 102A Deep Cycle batteries
- 1 x 2000W 24V True Sinewave Inverter (so that future increased needs can be accommodated)
- 4 x panel roof mounts
- \Box Cables, connectors and flex
- Installation.

It is important to invest in the right equipment from the beginning. Of course, thereafter as you add more appliances to your solar power system, you would need to increase the size of all the above components, so it is absolutely essential to consult a professional company for assistance. The most important is to

invest in a system which you can add onto, without making what you already have redundant. Batteries can always be added, but your biggest single cash layout would be for the Inverter and Solar regulators. In this way, you will be able to start off with a system costing less than R20 000 and expand that to a system worth R300 000 over a period of time, without problems.

There are many adaptations found in the solar industry such as cells that have been integrated into building materials, for example Solar Roof Tiles. These integrated technologies are relatively new, but will definitely become more popular in the future.

As the costs of the various solar components are dependent on what you buy and for what use you want them, it is worth exploring the many suppliers and, as always, ask for references.

Check the bedrooms that your grown-up-and-now-at-college children used to occupy: lots of stuff there that will never be needed again. If you start early on a spring morning you'll be surprised how much clear space you can create before lunchtime.

Physical clutter accumulates everywhere. Even those of us who feel we have it under control can be surprised how difficult it is to move house or office, or retire and downsize. Part of the problem is that it is often as much an emotional issue as it is a question of physical space, especially when possessions hold memories of personal times past or belong to loved ones who have moved on with their lives or passed away.

Blended families MAKING IT WORK

With divorce rates being so high, second blended marriages and families are becoming the new norm. Chances are you are a step-parent or your spouse is one, or maybe even one of your own parents is a step-parent. Successfully blending two families is no simple task and the complexities should not be underestimated. There is a lot that needs to be considered and well thought through, requiring much discussion within the family.

THE CHALLENGES

Statistics worldwide show that failure rates on marriages are high, around 50% for first marriages and 75% of second marriages, with very few of these second marriages surviving the first five years. Parenting within blended families is also more difficult with issues like authority, affection, challenges and role ambiguity manifesting. Parents potentially face animosity from their step-children, feelings

of resentment, with children feeling that they need to compete for their parent's attention – all potentially causing conflict between the children and the adults in the home. Many of these marriages fail because these important discussions are not had up-front, where decisions can be made to help drive the day-to-day running of a blended home. Remember also that divorce creates a sense of abandonment and therefore everyone has a heightened need for safety and security. This could result in rushed or ill-thought-through decisions to enter into a second marriage, for perhaps the wrong reasons, so be very aware of this.

This process entails massive changes – maybe a new home in a new

neighbourhood with new schools, in the daily home life routine, there are others to now consider or consult, the stress of adapting, less time with your parent... the list goes on. Everyone will need time to adjust.

SO, CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING

No two blended families are the same and each one is shaped by their unique shared experiences and level of involvement by family members, but the following could be useful to consider.

Conversations: There are three sets of important conversations that need to take place – one within your existing family, the other with your new spouse and finally a third, with your spouse's children. The best way to address uncertainty, fear and any other negative emotion would be to talk about it, preferably before the marriage even takes place. Ongoing, open and honest discussions throughout will also help avoid conflict.

Listen: The children must feel heard, so allow them an opportunity to talk and express themselves. Listen with empathy and try not to discount what they are feeling. Perspective through the eyes of a child will always be different, but to them, it is very real and unsettling. Children who feel heard will feel safer.

Your relationship: Remember this is the core reason the family came together in the first place so focusing on your relationship is critical. Try to do things together as a couple and have some alone time.

Parenting approach: In the conversation with your new spouse, discuss things like discipline, decision-making, your individual parenting styles, how to share special occasions, boundaries – all the potential hot topics that can lead to arguments and unhappiness. Create a new way of doing things within your new family.

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Career guidance and psychometric testing.
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Discipline: All the experts agree that, the step-parent should never be the primary disciplinarian - especially initially. This should always be the biological parent but with consistent and fair support from the new spouse. This is a tough one! But, failing to consider this approach could result in resentment building between the parent and step-child, leading to endless rounds of conflict. What often happens then is that the biological parent starts over compensating to make up/cover up for the "harsh" step-parents, which results in further negativity, now amongst the parents. By supporting the biological parent in disciplining, the relationship with the step-child will form faster.

Alone time: It is so important for each child to feel valued and important. It would be so easy for them to "get lost" within the new family dynamics. One-on-one time or a special activity with each of your children and with your step-children will go a long way to make them feel special and secure. Support individual relationships with each child.

Family meetings: Consider Life Talk's Table Tuesday initiative, which could work perfectly for this. Pick a day when everyone is home regularly and together and make this your new family's meeting day. It creates opportunity to bond and be together but also to have the opportunity to express opinions and talk about things – both positive and negative. Creating new family traditions are also useful – something which will be unique to this family.

Be fair: Especially towards your stepchildren and take an interest in them. It might be tricky to start with but once you

 Self-esteem focused courses suitable for all staff available. get to know and understand them better, it will undoubtedly have a positive impact on your relationship.

Accept each other. Look for the good in each person and don't focus on the not-sogood parts.

SOME DON'TS

Lessons learnt by others are invaluable and can save you much heartache.

- Don't push relationships rather let them develop naturally. These relationships will be more authentic and this will lay solid long-term foundations.
- Don't resent one-on-one time or compete for attention. Individual family members feeling happy, safe and secure should be a priority.
- Don't under- or over-discipline a common mistake. And be consistent in your disciplining.
- Don't lose your temper or at least try not to! It won't help the situation and will foster more negativity and resentment.
- Try to act lovingly towards your step-child even if you don't love them. In time these feelings may well become genuine.

Younger children seem to adapt and adjust better to the new blended family so if you have teens in the home, be aware that this may not be an easily accepted transition for them and they may need professional help to cope. In fact, children from blended homes are three times more likely to need counselling or other professional care.

Finding the right balance takes time. The chances of being happy a second time around may seem slim but with some effort, love and patience there is no reason why your blended family can't be a success.

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

A study published in *The Journal of Child Psychology and Psychiatry* in America concluded that 98 percent of children under the age of 10 are dreadful little brats.

The study has met with a sharp and negative reaction from adults involved with children under 10.

My two little girls were so charming as children and so filled with praise for their parents ("you're the best mummy and daddy in the world!"), especially at Christmas, that it was only a pleasure to buy them whatever they wanted. Me?



Manipulated? Absurd!

The kid next door was different. I heard him tell his mother, "I want an ice cream!" She said, "And what's the magic word?" He said, "NOW!"

A Saxonwold reader, Glenda, who has two small daughters, forwarded some parental observations regarding bringing up children. These are not necessarily her own views, I hasten to add:

You spend the first two years of their lives teaching them to walk and talk. Then you spend the next sixteen telling them to sit down and shut up.

When their children become teenagers a lot of mothers begin to appreciate why some animals eat their young.

In later life God rewards them – grandchildren are God's reward for not eating one's children.

Glenda said, "Children seldom misquote you. In fact they usually repeat word for word what you should not have said". One of the best things about holding children's parties is to remind yourself that there are children more awful than your own.

And she says, "It's no good trying to childproof your home – they still get in". When you come to think of it, despite God's omnipotence He still fell short with His own children. After creating heaven and earth, God created Adam and Eve and, according to the Bible, He immediately said to them, "DON'T!"

Eve: Did not!

Adam: Did so.

God, having had it with the pair of them, decreed they should have children of their own. Thus the pattern was set for ever and ever.
