

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

MORE ESTATES AND HOMEOWNERS ARE 'GETTING OFF THE GRID'. DRILLING A BOREHOLE IS A GOOD START.

The world is clearly getting warmer – 2016 was recorded as the hottest year since records have been kept, and experts say this trend is likely to continue over the years to come. As the world heats up, the availability of water supplies to meet water needs is coming under pressure. Currently, large parts of South Africa face drought conditions, and the scarcity of water means we are limited – sometimes severely – in our ability to water plants, take baths and showers, do the laundry, wash up and maintain swimming pools.

Enter the borehole, which is becoming a strong trend among property owners all over South Africa.

The success rate of finding water is between 60% and 85% in ideal conditions, which preclude difficult geological terrain and heavy urban infrastructure such as electrical cables and pipelines, which make drilling difficult. The ultimate cost of drilling a borehole depends on the depth to the water-bearing geological formation, and the amount of loose or weathered material that needs to be cased off.

The average drilling cost is around R600 a metre, according to the Borehole Water Association of Southern Africa (BWA). Once drilling is done and groundwater has been found, there's another outlay for installing a pump – about R25 000 to R30 000 – and then about R12 000 for the laboratory water tests. The BWA advises that before you get a quote, find out from neighbours what it cost to install their boreholes so that you can get a sense of how much it could cost you.

Drilling is a disruption but only for a short period of time, as high-pressure air compressors are used for drilling. One can expect some noise whilst operating, and mud and water coming from the borehole. Borehole companies don't test the quality of the water found, but will recommend that you take a test sample to a laboratory close to you. You will get the results within about three days.

Is it worth it?

Speak to a homeowner who is using borehole water to maintain their lawn and service household needs, and you'll find that the expense was worth it. "I use only borehole water for my garden, and I invested in a filtration system so that it can be used for the household as well. It has made a huge difference to my municipal services bill, and I save about R3 000 a month on my water bill. Water independence from municipal sources is one of the biggest reasons behind the popularity of boreholes in South Africa."

So yes, if you're planning to settle down for a long stretch of time, or you're looking for a good return on investment, a borehole is not only a green conscious choice, but a sound investment too.

Documentation requirements for all persons conducting any form of work at your premises

- Valid South African ID or drivers licence
- Valid passport with a valid work permit (Foreign Nationals)
- Valid asylum documents (Foreign Nationals)
- Any copies of the above documents must be clear copies and must be certified by the South African Police Service
- Certified copies older than 7 months will not be accepted (South Africans)
- Certified copies older than 3 months will not be accepted (Foreign Nationals)
- If a person has lost his/her documents, they will need to provide an affidavit from the South African Police Service, stamped and signed
- If a person has applied for their documents, a certified copy of the receipt of application must be provided together with an affidavit from the South African Police Services, stamped and signed

Planting Your Own **Edible** Garden

There are countless reasons to grow some of your own food: to be more selfsufficient; to teach your children a powerful skill that is also a great joy; or simply to tuck into an honest salad whenever your heart desires. Here are some tips and guidance for beginner gardeners.

Steps you'll take before planting a single seed

The three most important—and very basic-things you'll give your garden are good soil, enough sun and plentiful (but not overly plentiful) water. When you're choosing where to plant your garden, think carefully about all three. You'll need a spot that gets plenty of sun throughout the day, has rich soil, and is close enough to the water supply that you'll be able to water freely without a big hassle.

Get Sunny

Most edibles want "full sun", or about six hours per day of good quality sunlight. (There are exceptions, like lettuces, which do well in shade. But it's easier to create shade where necessary than to create sun). Spots with southern exposure do well.

Try to choose a spot that is somewhat protected from wind. If you're very restricted in space and sunlight



(gardening on an urban balcony, for example), don't despair. There are plenty of online resources to help you choose the right plants for your conditions.



Get Grounded As for soil, there are three primary options: use the ground you've got, plant in raised beds, or plant in containers. If you're considering

planting in the ground, learn a bit

about your soil conditions.

Do you have clay soil or loamy (sandy) soil? An easy way to find out is to wet some dirt and press it between your fingers. If it's sticky or slimy, it's clay. If it's gritty and dries quickly, it's sand. Knowing which type of soil you have will help you decide how to amend itwhat to add to make it closer to plants' ideal growing medium.

If it's your first go at a garden, start small. You'd be surprised how much you can grow in a handful of square feet.

About two to three weeks before you're ready to plant, clear any grass and weeds with a sod cutter. Turn your soil with a roto-tiller or a good oldfashioned shovel. Finally, add lots of organic compost.

If you're not happy with the quality of

your soil or just want a beautiful, accessible garden, another great option is to plant in raised beds. You'll build (or purchase) a structure in which to place goodquality topsoil and plant your seeds or starters there.

If you're planting in an urban environment, want to keep the garden close to the house, or just want to start small, planting in containers is the way to go. You will be surprised to learn what a tremendous variety of edibles can grow well in pots. Don't overlook this convenient option for herbs, fruits, and vegetables alike.



Get Hungry Think closely about what you'd like to eat this summer.

It helps to know which hardiness zone you're in so you'll know what grows easily in your area and when to plant it, but beyond that, what to grow comes down largely to personal preference.

Are you a salad fan, or do you prefer roasted veggies even in the hot weather? How much fruit do you like to eat compared to vegetables? Which herbs do you gravitate toward? It's a good idea to plant mostly foods you already know and love, with maybe one or two less familiar foods thrown in to keep it interesting.

If you'll be planting some of your crops from seed, either to start indoors or in the ground as the weather warms up, now is the time to order.

So why not give it a try!

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



If your attention and affection is performance-based you are not loving them for who they are but for what they do. Your children are not you and may never become a clone of you. Love them for who they are, not what you expect them to be or do and this is what will grow their confidence and self-belief.



P......Protective: Dads are a symbol of physical and emotional security and they are often less easy to manipulate than mums when it comes to implementing boundaries.

While you may be the family 'fixer' on many levels because you get things sorted, your role is also to teach your children to become resourceful and resilient in themselves, to learn independence little by little. These are the tools they will use to create their own happiness and success one day.

THE CURIOSITY CLASS

With schools back in action again, kids once more aligned to the routines and the associated activities of being educated, I paused to reflect on my own school journey, one more time.

Wondering, as I imagine many of us do, what was it all about?

Although a great deal of that is fairly blurry, there are some key memories that once I call on them, become pretty clearly.

One of these is...

At primary school I made it my objective to sit as far back from the front of the class as I possibly could, and whenever I could, next to a window. Even through my surname, beginning with 'B', had me marked to be sitting in the front of the class, I was happiest when at the back, looking out a window.

I could say gazing, or even contemplating – out the window, which I will expand on shortly – because I realise now that it was more than just looking.

To succeed in this preferred seating arrangement, I had to be just a little earlier back in the class than the other kids, so as to avoid any challenges to my choice of seat.

It didn't always work out the way I wanted it. Yet, I do recall I was able to bag my window preference more often, than not.

One key disrupter was the awful English spelling class, where we all had to endure the pain of an open spelling challenge. I found these very stressful, most likely because I wasn't very accomplished as a speller – as some of you may have noticed in my ramblings thus far. I have also long suspected, that I suffer from a mild form of dyslexia, which back in the last mid-century wasn't that well known – so it wasn't a condition that you could claim as a get-out-of-jailcard for poor spelling.

The spelling test would always

proceed in the alphabetical order of surnames, which completely messed with my preferred seating arrangements.

The awful process would begin with me in the third seat from the teacher's right hand side, front row. Being the second 'B' surname in the class, this was always my starting position.

The teacher would read out a word to each student. We would then have to stand and recite back our answer.



Should the student get the wrong answer, they would move down a seat. If they got it right they stayed where they were, so after the first round, I would move from third seat to fourth seat. You get the picture.

Usually, by the end of this awful experience, I would find myself somewhere toward the back of the class, but not always near a window. If I were, it wouldn't be long before I was on the move again. Truly awful. Fortunately, for most of the other tedious subjects I endured, I was able to secure my preferred seat toward the back, next to a window.

I was more than content, to ponder, gazing out into the open spaces on the other side of the glass window, allowing the monotonous droning of the teacher to become some white noise that fizzed in the background, hardly noticeable like a harmless mosquito. My classroom behaviour wasn't, as I suspect many of you may be thinking, a dislike of teachers or the subjects they taught, so much as it was my fulfilling a deep curiosity.

It is hardly surprising then, that I didn't do particularly well at school.

But the time wasn't wasted either.

I believe those years of gazing out of classroom windows, into grey skies full

of rain or snow, or big white fluffy clouds floating on hazy blues, deepened and strengthened my curiosity drive.

I wasn't aware then, but I was using those contemplative classroom sessions to ask all sorts of questions. I wasn't simply 'daydreaming'; I was actively engaged in imaginative scenario creations.

I would entertain ideas like...

If I could fly like a bird, how long would it take me to swoop down from the windowsill of the classroom, across the playground, over the hedges and trees at the school boundary, through and over the hills at the end of the village, and then down again along the length of the river Chess to the bridge that I would sit at watching the river flow by, beneath my feet.

As I entertained the idea – I would become the bird, watching as the landscapes flew past below me, and conscious of the time it took for me to get to the bridge, observing all the smaller details along the way. I would then fly back to the windowsill, for a different perspective.

There were many more imaginative scenarios that I would build...

Often in winter, ice would build up on the outside of the classroom windows overnight. When the classrooms started to warm up once we were inside, these static ice sheets became active. I would concentrate with deep focus on a particular spot, throwing my entire mind behind an intention to cause that particular spot to melt and move. I was rarely disappointed, with a mind like a laser the exact spot of ice would move on my command. Again I would set time lines as to when whole sections of ice would shift and slide. I would anticipate and predict which piece would move next and so on. I would sculpt the ice into shapes from the relative comfort of a classroom chair.

As I reflect on those long ago days, I recognise that the habit of gazing hasn't left me at all. The schoolyards have, but my deep yearning to question and imagine has remained.

Do we even need to question and raise the what, why, where and how – any longer?

Surely with the swipe of a fingertip Google provides?

After all, we do have so much more at our fingertips today, don't we?

A last thought...

From time to time I am asked to facilitate on creativity at business schools. I have what I call my magic bag. It looks just like a magician's bag, full of sparkles, stars, half moons and bright coloured fabrics. In the bag is a wide collection of everyday objects. Things like, a piece of string, a kitchen plug, a spring, a paperclip and so on, there are over fifty different pieces. I use this tool when helping leadership groups develop alternative creative ideas for the serious challenges they are confronting.

It works like this...

We see things for what they are, a tea strainer is a tea strainer, yet take a moment and consider – with a little applied curiosity – that same tea strainer can become the sieve that separates the good practices of business from the unwanted, the unethical. The tea strainer becomes the visual representation of an action that our business maybe missing.

Curiosity is a valuable asset.

An active curiosity may well be the most important attribute we need and certainly one that our children shouldn't leave behind at school.

Till next time, stay curious.
