# MESSAGE FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

**Dear Residents** 

It is alarming to note that a large number of gated estates in SA are experiencing serious road traffic violations.

Homeowners need to acknowledge that when they chose to purchase property within the estate and become members of the Association, they agreed to be bound by its rules.

For those homeowners who have paid the premium attached to living in a lifestyle estate such as Fourways Gardens, the issue of safety (for both them and their children) is often a primary reason behind the decision to invest. A component of that safety issue (outside of the traditional security reasons) is the idyllic notion of our children being able to roam around our peaceful estate on foot or bikes, and enjoy the luxury that we experienced as children.

The reality is somewhat different as, very often, and particularly in larger estates such as FWG, our very own local Grand Prix wannabes turn the imagined tranquillity into the proverbial 'accident waiting for a place to happen'. And in all seriousness this can be a deadly problem.

The posted speed limit of 40 km/h, and the traffic signs within the estates are there for a reason. They are in place to keep the residents (and visitors) safe, and the Home Owners Association has a responsibility and duty to take all rational and reasonable measures to protect the residents. One of the issues the HOA is entrusted with, is the task of ensuring that the estate remains safe and secure, properly maintained, pleasing to the eye and a generally happy place to live and be in. In so doing, they might have



to approach and interact with residents, visitors and homeowners from time to time, when they disregard rules agreed to by members.

Over the past few weeks, the Fourways Gardens Neighbourhood Facebook page has been very active with complaints about reckless driving in the estate. Security has been instructed to take a 'ZERO tolerance' on road traffic incidents. The biggest issue is speeding and not adhering to Stop signs as Yield signs.

I have summarised the road traffic penalties for the month of May, for your information and record.

Nature of Penalty	Residents	Visitors
Speeding	1	1
Not stopping at Stop Signs	9	27
Total	10	28

As we can see from the above stats, the biggest offenders are visitors, so we request residents to please advise their contractors/visitors of the Estate Rules. Management and the Board of Directors further wish to remind residents of the recent Supreme Court of Appeal ruling that speed limits in private residential estates are legally enforceable.

This specifically refers to the legal case involving the *Mount Edgecombe Country Club Estate Management Association II (RF) NPC v Singh* and others, where the Supreme Court of Appeal has ruled that private residential estates are indeed legally entitled to enforce the rules of such estate against its residents as members of the estate Home Owners Association, including those rules relating to speed limits on the roads within the estate.

It is to everyone's benefit to comply with these regulations, so please, slow down.

# EMPLOYEE AND CONTRACTOR DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS



lease ensure that all persons employed by you in your home have been SAPS cleared and have all the correct documentation. They must be registered onto the Fourways Gardens Estate biometric system for your property.

Contractors conducting work or providing a quotation for work to be undertaken at your home must have the correct documentation. Only use reputable companies with references. Also, ensure that you are always aware of the number

of people coming to your home, and that they are under constant supervision.

Documentation requirements for all people conducting any form of work at your premises:

- For South African citizens, a valid South African ID or driver's licence.
- For Foreign Nationals, a valid passport with a valid work permit.
- Additionally, Foreign Nationals must submit valid asylum documents.
- Any copies of the above documents must be clear copies and must be certified by

the South African Police Service.

- For South Africans, certified copies older than 7 months will not be accepted.
- For Foreign Nationals, certified copies older than 3 months will not be accepted.
- If a person has lost his/her documents, they will need to provide an affidavit from the South African Police Service, stamped and signed.
- If a person has applied for their documents, a certified copy of the receipt of application must be provided together with an affidavit from the South African Police Services, stamped and signed.

# A BIG WAKE-UP CALL TO RESIDENTS!

No watering between 7am and 4pm.
No washing of driveways or paving from hoses.



eagen Donnely from Rand Water addressed the FWG Gardening Club on 13 June 2019 and it was a HUGE wake up call.

### Here are some grisly facts:


- We are at Level 1 Water Restrictions. If we water between 7am and 4pm, JMPD will visit and fine us. The penalties: R1 000,00 for first offenders and R5 000,00 for repeat offenders.
- Gauteng's natural water supplies cannot meet demands. Johannesburg has no natural water supply.
- There is a continuous increase in water demand due to urbanisation, industry and electricity demand.
- Dam levels in Gauteng are lower than at the same time last year.
- In most areas in South Africa, evapotranspiration is higher than the rainfall received.
- Annual evapotranspiration ranges from 1 100mm – 4 000mm.



- Conversion ratios of rain available as surface water: stream flow into rivers -Canada: 65%
- Australia: 9,8%
- South Africa: 8,6% (World Bank Group, 2015)
- The world average rainfall is around 860mm per year.
- SA receives approximately 497mm per year.
- Our climate is changing hotter and drier conditions in South Africa.
- Rainfall will become more unpredictable and extreme.
- Northern Region prediction: 5 10% decrease in rain and increase in evapotranspiration.

### WHAT CAN WE DO?

- 60% of the wastewater that leaves a household is potentially available for re-use. Have a simple grey water system fitted for your bath water and washing machine.
- Understand your water meter if it's moving and you have no tap running, you probably have a leak.
- Fix leaking taps.
- Hydro-zone your landscape (High / Medium / Low).
- Irrigate according to zones, based on water needs and change for each season.
- Link irrigation to a controller and rain sensor.
- · Install water meters in the landscape.
- Mulch your garden.





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






# THE PERFECT GARDEN THIS JULY

If you are looking for a change of scenery or just to update the overall look and feel of your garden, now is an ideal time.



### TO DO

- 1. WINTER GARDENING FOR HERBS AND VEGGIES: If you want a good crop of herbs and vegetables in winter then raised beds are a good idea as their soil temperature is higher. Greenhouses and tunnels are recommended in areas subject to extreme temperature fluctuations. Only grow vegetables that do well in cooler conditions. Sow seeds of carrots, radishes, broad beans and beetroot until the end of August.
- **2. PRUNE:** It's a wonder that July has not been renamed pru-ly in South African circles, because a consistent theme this
- month, countywide, is pruning. This is especially true for fruit trees and roses, but also any deciduous shrubs that may be in need of a trim. Remember to shred all your cuttings and pop them onto the compost heap that you've almost certainly already started, haven't you? It's important for you to perform the process now and not delay until the flowering season starts.
- 3. IMPROVE THE LAYOUT: As you can now see the bones of the garden, consider possible design changes that you could make. In dry areas, winter
- is the ideal time to erect a pergola or archway, redo the paths and redesign the beds. Take the opportunity to level sloping, uneven areas and build steps to link different levels.
- **4. FEEDING AND MULCHING:** Do this right after pruning. Remove the annuals that have finished flowering then work compost and organic pellets into the beds. If the soil drains well, work these lightly into the top 3 5cm. If the soil is clay or rocky, dig in compost to at least a fork's depth, but take care not to disturb the roots of the plants.





Here's one of her recipes for you to try for yourself:

# **BOBOTIE**

### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1kg beef mince
- 1 onion
- 1 tablespoon apricot jam
- 1 tablespoon chutney
- 1 slice white bread
- 2 teaspoons oil/butter
- 5 6 eggs
- 250ml milk
- 25ml lemon juice
- 2 teaspoons curry powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon turmeric
- 5 bay leaves

### **METHOD**

Preheat the oven at 180°C.

Chop the onion and fry in a little oil or butter. Blend together all the spices, jam, chutney and lemon juice to make a mixture.

Soak the bread in half the milk, squeeze out excess milk and add to the mince.

Add the spice mixture and cooked onions to the mince.

Lightly grease an ovenproof dish and press the mince mixture into the dish.

Bake the mince mixture in the oven for 10 - 15 minutes until slightly brown.

While the mince is in the oven, start on the egg mixture.

Mix together the rest of the milk and eggs and pour over slightly cooled mince.

Garnish with the bay leaves and bake for 30 - 40 minutes until set.

Serve with fluffy basmati rice and a green salad (optional).





### STAFF TRAINING ESSENTIAL

One of Secure Drive's slogans is 'offering a first world service in third world environments'. To achieve this, they have to make sure all their staff are thoroughly trained and alert.





There are so many variables when it comes to travelling, so working through different scenarios is essential. For example, if someone starts shooting in a public place, what do you do? If there's a medical emergency during peak hour traffic when all the roads are gridlocked, what do you do?

In addition to individual training, they conduct team building exercises and their staff are incentivised. Those who are rated top of their category receive a bonus.

"We also try to look after their health and fitness, so we have a wellness programme for them which includes giving them access to a gym, and martial arts training."

### **LOCAL SECURITY**

But criminals are becoming smarter. Even a simple thing like taking a taxi or using an e-hailing service can become a security risk, especially with the ongoing conflict between Uber and the metered taxi drivers - a situation like that provides the perfect opportunity for a criminal to take advantage and mug the traveller while everyone is distracted. For those using hire cars, there's the remote jamming risk that they might not be aware of, being in the vicinity of cash in transit heists, smash-and-grabs and hijackings."

### **RISK ANALYSIS**

Through the GSOC facility, along with access to social media, traffic reports and information about any protest action or mass meetings, the Secure Drive analysts are able to determine risk probabilities for different areas. In addition, their vehicles are all fitted with tracking devices that provide comms updates, so they have real-time access to information, which they are then able to pass on to their clients. This helps the clients to ensure the safety of their staff and helps them keep tabs on what's happening abroad.

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# **2019 PORSCHE 911 CARRERA S/4S**

he Porsche 911 made its first international debut in 1963. With each passing generation of 911, motoring enthusiasts around the world are faced with one burning question: "How will Porsche manage to improve upon this?" Fast forward 56 years and you're greeted by the 8th generation of 911, dubbed '992'.

A Porsche has always been something that is instantly recognisable, particularly the 911 which has retained a strikingly familiar silhouette even 56 years down the line. The designers of the 992 took the profile of its predecessor and further enhanced it to create a timeless design instantly recognisable as 911. The most drastic enhancement comes with the introduction of the now signature fulled rear light bar, a sight to behold in the dead of night. Upon close inspection of the 992, you will notice just how dramatic its styling is, with deep curves and

aggressive body-lines. One such effect is the lengthening of the bonnet cutline harking back to the 1974 G-series. Both Carrera S and 4S models now have the same width rear-track, which was previously exclusive to the 4S.

Step inside the 992 and you are greeted with an overwhelming sense of sturdiness and a subtle whiff of over-engineering. Gone is the traditional gear-shifter, which has been replaced by a fob-like selector - this has been at the centre of criticism, having lost the functionality of manual shifting. Just as well, the paddle shifters are a pleasure to engage with.

Taking front and centre is the new 10,9-inch PCM display featuring AppleCarPlay/AndroidAuto, SatNav as well as a few drive mode settings. Its operation is sleek, simple and effective. One of the major talking points has to be the two 7-inch displays in the

instrument cluster which have the ability to display navigation, media and driving data. Separating the two screens is a large traditional rev-counter reminiscent of 992's predecessors. Porsche has perfected the art of creating a modern interior design whilst paying homage to 911s of late. The result? Timeless

At the belly of the beast lies the same 3-litre twin-turbo flat-six, albeit heavily revised, kicking out a staggering 331kW and 530Nm which results in a 100km/h sprint time of less than 4 seconds for both the S and 4S. In fact, the 4S will see the obligatory sprint in just 3,4 seconds and it will still keep pushing onto a staggering 308km/h. All that power is tied together by a new 8-Speed PDK with shorter gear ratios than the model it replaces. PDK has always been considered the pinnacle of transmissions, some would even say it has mind-reading capabilities and, in the 992 application, it is no different. The

sound? Breath-taking. With the sports-exhaust option, it gives off an incredible raspy tone with audible crackles and pops when you let off the gas.

Piloting the 992 is a sensation on its own. Stick it on a demanding mountain pass and you will quickly realise its capabilities. The speed at which you can carry through corners and still accelerate out is staggering and you would still be hard-pressed to challenge the grip levels even when driving with intent. What was particularly impressive was how well the steering adjusted at speed through corners with confidence-inspiring weight and admirable levels of feedback. I cannot emphasise enough how brilliantly the 992 handles itself. I struggled to fathom that Porsche would still release hotter variants of the already brilliant sports car. When you finally decide to quit being a race-car driver, you can slot the 992 into comfort mode and it becomes as comfortable as a well-accomplished sedan. See, that's the thing about the 992. It offers hooliganist levels of performance, but it still manages to slip through traffic and be as easy to live with on a daily basis as a Golf.

The new 992 challenges the levels of Porsche engineering, adding more speed, more grip and much improved daily livability. Its predecessor already ticked those boxes, but the 992 has gone and doubled ticked them. It has a starting price of R1,7 million and, honestly, at that price point, you will not find a better vehicle that boasts super-car like performance with the ability to function as an everyday commuter at the same time.

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




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## SOUTH AFRICA AND THE *REAL* BOKKE

facet of South Africa – the one that puts us ahead of any other nation that I can think of – can be described in one word: variety.

Packed into our region are 900 species of birds, at least as many species of butterflies and 400 species of reptiles. We have 22 500 species of plants which account for our wondrous variety of animals, including the world's biggest land mammal, the elephant; the second and third biggest mammals, the white rhino and hippo; the world's tallest animal, the giraffe; and the world's smallest mammal, the 2,5 gram pygmy shrew whose metabolism is so rapid it would starve to death in less than three hours if it did not eat.

And within that diversity we have what is, I am sure, a unique variety of antelopes – 29 species, ranging from the almost one-ton eland to the tiny 4kg blue duiker whose shoulder height barely reaches

halfway up one's shin. The good news is that, these days, we are seeing more and more antelope as we travel along our trunk roads.

And the most handsome of all antelopes? It is surely the sable with its beautifully swept-back curved horns. It is also one of the rarest. From Gauteng, the most likely place to see them is probably the Pilanesberg National Park northwest of the Magaliesberg. In fact, it was in the Magaliesberg that, in the 1830s, Cornwallis Harris, a British Indian Army officer, first described the sable which, until then, was unheard of in the outside world.

There are said to be 325 in Kruger Park, mostly around Pretoriuskop and high up in the northwest of the park.

In the 1960s, without realising it, I saw what proved to be the start of their population decline in Kruger. I attended the opening of a number of artificial

water holes funded, in part, by public donations. With good intention and much planning, they were placed in areas most stressed by drought.

Most of those holes have long been abandoned. It was found, during the dry seasons, that no longer did one get large numbers of impala drinking at a waterhole - they were now able to disperse. This enabled predators, especially lions and leopards that staked out the holes, to more easily spot the larger antelope such as waterbuck (the lions' preferred prey species in Kruger Park), kudu, sable and roan, and bring them down. Until then, the numbers of impala had acted as a buffer species 'shielding' the larger antelope.





One of the larger antelopes, the blue wildebeest, and its grazing companion the zebra, overpopulated some areas in the '60s and '70s to such an extent it lead to overgrazing, especially around water holes, thus demolishing the rarer grasses favoured by sable and its cousin, the roan.

The last roan I saw in Kruger Park, 20 years ago, was near Tsokwane in the central district. Their population is down to about 50 and, like the sable, they are listed as 'endangered'. So is the tsessebe – arguably the swiftest antelope in the park. They can sometimes be spotted in the Pretoriuskop area of Kruger Park and can be seen in the Pilanesberg, Marakele and Mokala, the last mentioned being a much underrated reserve near Kimberley.

The impala is usually cited as the most common buck in Kruger Park - its

population is in excess of 120 000. But Dr Mike Cohen, former director of the Department of Environmental Affairs and Tourism and now an environmental consultant based in the Eastern Cape, suggests that the most common antelope might well be the diminutive steenbok.

Cohen did a three-year doctoral study of steenbok in Kruger Park and found some individual's territory was less than a hectare. He also discovered their incredible flexibility regarding habitat – they occupied almost every type of veld. Kruger Park has nearly 2 million hectares . . . and a steenbok is happy with just one.

One of the rarest antelope in Africa – yet easy enough to see – is the bontebok whose name is derived from the conspicuous white blaze (bont) that runs from under its eyes to its nose and appears to have been slapped on by a wide brush. It is unique to the southern Cape and came very near to extinction a century ago. Its decline was accelerated by it being bundled along during the lemming-like mass springbok migrations that flowed across the southern Karoo in the 19th century. They headed west into South Africa's most arid region where they perished.

The last great migration was in 1896 and TB Davie, who witnessed it, said it

was strung out "over 138 miles (220km) and, in places, was 15 miles wide". The animals moved slowly like docile sheep and Davie, driving a horse-drawn cart, described how he became caught up in the 'moving mass' and how the animals moved aside, 'displaying resignation rather than fear'.

They passed through 'dorps' where they were slaughtered. Everywhere, the middens of skins and heaps of skeletons grew and village trees were festooned with biltong. Helplessly carried along by the springbok, they were picked off as 'sports' (oddities) by trigger-happy farmers.

A century ago (1920), when bontebok were on the brink of extinction, concerned farmers fenced in 84 of them in what is today one of our smallest national parks – the Bontebok National Park in the Western Cape – where they now flourish.

Our largest antelope is the eland and, in the early 1900s, the Russians attempted to domesticate them, finding they yielded up to 7 litres of milk at a milking. In the wilds they yield half of that. But, as the Russians discovered, and subsequent experiments found, corralling a 900kg antelope that can leap a 3 metre fence is not anywhere near as easy, or productive, as keeping a cow.


under his tutelage. Reading these letters always reminds him of his purpose.





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# HAPPY TUM OR A RUMBLE DOWNUNDER?

## THE FULL SCOOP ON PET POOP.

pet's toilet troubles can send the most stoic owner into a tail-spin. Not just because of the discomfort and distress these cause our fur-babies, but because it means someone has to manage the ... er... fallout. Now, for a conversation best avoided at the dinner table . . .

## IT SHOULD BE BROWN, NEVER BLOODY

Blood is a substance that should stay in the body and ideally not come out of it, so whenever you see blood in your pet's stool, it's something to be taken seriously.

Bright red blood usually indicates damage to the colon. It could happen as a result of something fairly innocuous like a small tear in the rectum or anus due to a hard stool. This would show up as a small amount of fresh blood on the surface of the stool of an otherwise happy pet. A more serious injury to the colon could result from something sharp (eg. piece of bone or stick) that has been swallowed and made its way down the GI tract, got stuck and is causing irritation or injury. In this case, the pet would be straining and showing discomfort.

If rectal bleeding is extensive or recurring, take your pet for a vet visit immediately, as something more sinister might be behind it.

You may think that only dogs are guilty of swallowing foreign objects, but occasionally cats are affected by an anxiety-induced condition called pica, where they, too, may chew and swallow non-food items.

Bleeding from the stomach or small intestine will result in a black, tarry stool. This can be a warning sign of an ulcer or a reaction to certain pain medications. If your pet has suffered a bloody nose and swallowed a lot of blood, this may also make his stool very dark.

## 'THE SQUIRTS'


Any number of factors may cause diarrhoea and it's important to bear in mind that, aside from a potentially serious underlying problem, the mere fact that diarrhoea drains the body of water and electrolytes means that it should be treated as serious. Young pups or kittens and older animals, or those with compromised immune systems, are particularly vulnerable and should be taken to the vet for the appropriate treatment at the very onset of diarrhoea.

Dietary indiscretions (fondly known as 'garbage disease') can cause a nasty diarrhoea and possibly vomiting too, particularly if whatever the pet ate was rotten. Keep refuse bins in designated areas that pets cannot access, check your garden after storms for dead baby birds that may have been blown from nests and keep an eye out for 'tasty morsels' that your dog might swoop on when out for a walk. The command 'Leave!' is a very useful one to have mastered before setting off on excursions which may yield 'delights' like discarded chicken bones, human faeces, etc.

Internal parasites like hookworm, protozoa like trichomonas, giardia and coccidia, as well as bacteria such as E.coli and Salmonella or viruses like parvo virus, distemper and others may be the cause of a runny tummy. Don't be tempted to consult Dr. Google regarding diarrhoea. If your pet is listless, off his food, the diarrhoea has lasted for more than a day, or he's vomiting and unable to keep fluids down, getting him to the vet for a professional diagnosis straight away could mean the difference between life and death. Ensuring that pets are regularly dewormed and vaccinated helps guard against some of the more sinister causes of diarrhoea.

Haemorrhagic Gastroenteritis, or HGE, is a particularly severe and life-threatening form of diarrhoea in dogs. Cats are fortunately not affected. Characterised by a stool ranging from a 'strawberry jam' consistency (due to the fresh blood in it) to a watery bloody diarrhoea, it's usually accompanied by vomiting and the dog is depressed and not eating. The lining of the entire intestine is damaged with HGE, which leads to rapid and severe dehydration, nausea, pain, electrolyte imbalance, shock and the risk of septicaemia. Time is of the essence in getting your dog to the vet and he will need to be admitted for life-saving treatment. HGE is most prevalent amongst smaller breeds and highly anxious dogs.

A common cause of tummy upsets is an abrupt change of food. Whenever a dietary change is indicated, whether you've decided to change pet food brands, have taken on a rescue pet with an unknown dietary history, or if your vet has recommended a change of food for medical reasons, always introduce the new food gradually, to allow the pet's gut fauna and flora to adapt to the new ingredients. To start with, split the recommended daily allowance so that it's made up 3/4 of the previous diet to 1/4 of the new product. Feed this mixture for 2 -3 days. If your pet's stool remains normal on this mix, go 50:50 and feed this mix for another 2 - 3 days. By this stage, your pet should be getting used to the new food nicely and you can taper the old diet to 1/4 of the food fed for another couple of days and then stop the previous diet altogether. Stop the process immediately if your pet shows signs of discomfort on

the new brand. Speak to your vet or one of the helpful staff at a Twisted Whiskers Deli for advice on a suitable alternative.

#### **ALL 'BACKED UP?'**

This can happen when a pet has either too little healthy fibre or too much indigestible fibre in their diet - check with your vet or Twisted Whiskers team member whether the diet you've chosen for your fur-baby is complete and balanced and supports gut health.

Other possible causes of constipation may be eating foreign objects like stones, bones, toys, fabric, etc. These can all cause nasty blockages which may end up having to be removed by your vet using enemas or even surgery.

Increasing your pet's exercise, adding some cooked pumpkin to the diet or treating with an over the counter product like Laxapet may help for the occasional hard stool. However, chronic constipation results from underlying medical conditions that will need additional treatment.

#### **GARDEN DELIGHTS**

As utterly gross as this habit is to us, eating poop, or coprophagia as it's formally termed, is a perfectly normal behaviour for dogs. Your dog won't be able to keep this little habit a secret from you, especially when he gets up close and personal for a smooch, eeeek! Many people worry that it's a sign of a nutrient deficiency, but this is seldom the case. Most often it has a behavioural cause.





Cats generally aren't poop-eaters, although kitty-poop is particularly flavoursome to canines, due to the high levels of proteins and fats excreted.

Regardless of how normal this habit is in canines, chances are it's not something you wish to live with, so steps need to be taken. **Copronat**, available from Twisted Whiskers, can be sprayed onto the food of the pet whose poop is being snacked on. Copronat does not affect the palatability of the food being eaten, but it luckily makes the pet's poop very unpalatable. Continuous use for a few months should be able to create an aversion to poop eating in a foul-mouthed canine.

Or you could try an old wives' tale that, by all accounts, works well. A small amount of raw baby marrow (courgette) or pineapple, grated over the pet's food, will undergo enzymatic changes in the gut that makes the end product superunappetising. Or so the legend goes. You have nothing to lose by trying it - dogs enjoy some vegetable matter in their diet

and find the sweet flavours pleasant; this will also not affect the overall nutrient balance of their diet.

And if you have a serial poop-eater on your hands, ensure that the garden is kept clean of waste at all times and that kitty litter trays are out of reach of anyone who has no business near them....


#### POOPING OUTSIDE THE BOX

Talking of kitties, they may also use their poop habits as a way of communicating with us, even though we'd prefer a more polite method. A common complaint by people owned by cats, is that their feline poops outside the designated litter tray. Unless the stool is abnormal in consistency, this usually has more to do with kitt's state of mind, than his physical health. A simple change of toilet arrangements may be all that's required to settle his nerves.

He may be too big for his tray and consequently ends up 'going' over the edge. Or he may be stressed by the location of the tray, particularly in a







multi-cat household where he feels he may be ambushed by another cat while attending to his toilette, and will choose a more private location.

Always have one litter tray available per cat in the home, plus one extra. Place them in quiet, private places away from the daily hustle and bustle. Cats are rather particular about the type of litter

they prefer, so if your feline is studiously avoiding his litter tray, try changing the litter medium and it might well have kitty happily scritching away within the confines of the tray.

It set me thinking . . . how, when I was a kid and life was simple, a knife was just a knife.

Being a Boy Scout I had a fixed-blade 'sheath knife' which was a Very Serious sort of knife used by interesting people such as the Royal Marine Commandos who slit enemy throats with it and Tarzan who stabbed crocodiles whenever they chased Jane.

Nowadays, knives are hi-tech and hi-priced. Some have saw edges for, I suppose, lumberjacks; some have hollow handles in which you can keep survival food like Smarties.

True, we also had folding knives when we were young, but they were simple 'jack knives'. They had a simple blade for cutting your finger and a spike for Boy Scouts to use when extricating stones from horses' hooves or helping little old ladies cross the road or getting on to buses.

I had obtained my jack knife from a school chum – he swopped it for a snail which, I kidded him, I had taught to jump. The knife was so heavy that when I attached it to my belt my pants fell down.

This new Leatherman knife I was telling you about compares with my old jack knife in the same way that a canoe compares with a nuclear-powered aircraft carrier.

The new Swiss Army knife is not to be sneezed at. It has 29 features including two blades, two screwdrivers (one a Philips), a wood saw, fish scaler, rasp, tweezers, pliers, scissors, wire cutter . . . and the sheath itself houses a ruler for map reading;

sticking plasters (for cut fingers); safety pins; a ballpoint pen; paper; needle; thread; fishing line; a hook; and a tiny 12-channel television set. (Just kidding about the TV - I wanted to see if you were still reading this, and you were!)

Monty then explained the important aspects of a good knife: its blade should hold its edge even after being used to prise open a safe; it must be sturdy enough to cut gum poles as well as for hammering them into the ground to build a seven-storey survival shelter with ladies' bar and shaded parking for 12 vehicles.

In critical situations - you know, when your peppermints have run out, you haven't seen water for seven says, you can't find an ATM that works and your girlfriend hasn't written for ages - "your knife becomes your best friend". That's Monty's philosophy. It would worry me if my knife was my best friend. Imagine having conversations with your knife. Imagine trying to borrow money from it.

Apparently, a survivalist should be able to hammer his (or her) knife into a tree so that it can be used as a step for climbing up to get some birds' eggs for lunch (or even for high tea) or to escape a thin lion.

Monty's knife's handle was made from red bushwillow, the heaviest wood in South Africa, according to Monty who is a fundi on trees. He is not to be confused with Polyporus mushrooms which are fungi on trees.

I must rush, I've just cut my finger, badly.
