




MESSAGE FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

Dear Residents

Wow, we are already four months into 2019, and the first school holidays are already over!

Our annual Easter Egg hunt took place on Sunday, 7 April 2019, and we are grateful for the break in the weather which contributed to a very successful and fun day, both for the children and parents.



My article this month is very relevant, and can save a homeowner a lot of time and money.

WHY HAVING UP-TO-DATE AND APPROVED BUILDING PLANS IS VITAL

South African banks are increasingly insisting that any residential property to be sold or in need of a home loan cannot be assisted unless the property has upto-date building plans that have been approved by the local municipality. For a seller to be fully compliant, he/she has to be able to show that the building has approved HOA and Council approved building plans.

The Fourways Gardens Architectural Review Committee (ARC) are finding that a number of owners who are in the process

of selling their property, do not have HOA and Council approved building plans, substantially which can delay the sale/transfer of the property. In today's 'buyer's market' the lack of HOA and Council approved building plans can result in the sale of the property being cancelled, which is not in the best interest of the seller or the buver.

The ARC are finding that, on the request for a Clearance Inspection/Certificate, often extensions and alterations have been done without any plans being submitted to the HOA or Council for approval. The seller must then go through the process of sourcing an architect to draft plans based on the current status, submit these plans to the HOA for approval, then to Council for approval, all of which takes time and money, and further delays the sale of the property.

As a typical example, the owner will add on a patio without permission and then, a few years later, enclose it as a braai room without any plans being submitted. Or he or she may convert a garage into a bedroom without any attempt to make it legal.

Sometimes owners simply do not know when they need to get approved plans. Others think that by doing the work themselves and 'sneaking the job through' they are saving considerable sums of cash - forgetting that later this will make it difficult to sell or pass the home on to heirs. Similarly, they may employ a substandard builder who either ignores or does not know the regulations.

Every homeowner should check if the building plans are available as soon as possible, and make sure that these correspond in all respects to the building as it now is - and that the building is compliant with the building regulations. If it transpires that the owner has no plans, he or she can try to obtain copies of those lodged at the municipality. If, once the owner has the plans and feels they are not up to checking whether the plans conform, they should consult an architect for assistance. In the event of defaults, the owner should take steps to rectify the omissions and errors. In some cases, it will be necessary to ask the architect to redraw the entire plan of the home and resubmit this for approval. This could be expensive - but there may be no alternative.

Some homeowners take the attitude that, as they do not intend to sell the home in the foreseeable future, they can leave gaining approvals for a later date, or leave it to others, such as their heirs. However, experience has shown that people regularly have to sell earlier than they expect, for example, for health or financial reasons.

To obtain fully-approved plans can take months, so it is better to do it now - delaying will simply compound existing difficulties, and could place big burdens on others.

On behalf of the Management Team, we assure you that we will continue to manage the Estate in such a manner that ensures your investment grows optimally.


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TAXI SERVICES AT FOURWAYS GARDENS ESTATE





s brilliant as the service is, a taxi service such as Uber is not without its problems, failures, faults, etc. And unfortunately, it has opened up avenues for criminal elements.

There have been reports of taxi drivers who have been robbed, or clients within the vehicle have been robbed by criminals posing as drivers, and there have been incidents of fake drivers picking up clients, etc.

THE DO'S AND DON'TS

- Ensure that the taxi driver is indeed registered with the service provider, e.g. Uber/Bolt.
- The driver's credentials can be checked via the support on your App.
- Ensure that the driver has a valid driver's license.
- · Send the driver a code before they arrive

to avoid delays and misunderstandings.

- Remember some of the rules and regulations of every vehicle entering the Estate:
- The driver must have a valid driver's license.
- If the driver is a foreign national, he/ she needs to have a South African traffic registration to enable them to drive with their foreign drivers' license.
- The vehicle must have a valid vehicle license disc.
- Ensure that your family and loved ones know where you are, and how far you are from your destination.
- Do not divulge too much information about yourself, family, etc. to the driver.
- Be aware of your surroundings and ensure that you are always travelling in the correct direction.
- When arriving with a taxi driver at the Estate, never use your fingerprint to gain access.
- Generate an access code in advance, to avoid issues and delays at the gate -

more than five minutes in advance.

- Ensure your driver has left the Estate once he has dropped you off. (On a number of occasions drivers were found loitering around the Estate, which poses a risk to yourself and other residents.)
- Ensure that the driver follows and complies with all access and exit procedures at the gates.

Security is a tough job, and the officers are trying to do their best. But it is not easy when they are verbally abused, ignored and disregarded. Taxi drivers, for example, come to the gate without an access code and when asked to move and come back once a code is obtained, the officers are given a tough time, and the drivers refuse to comply with the Estate procedures. When the driver arrives to collect the client, he/ she complains about the supposedly bad and rude service received by the officers. There are always two sides to a story; the taxi driver just wants to get in to pick up the client with little or no regard for the safety procedures and access procedures that need to be followed. Please play your part by making sure that your taxi service is aware of the security requirements.

BOTANY OF DESIRE

How mankind has manipulated plants to suit their needs!

ue from Garden Shop at Broadacres again held us fascinated as she revealed how plants fight for survival. Unlike humans, who can nomadically wander in search of food and water, plants can't. One example is the massive trees in Yellowstone Park in the USA. These trees are 2000 – 3000 years old and have survived many environmental changes over those years.

According to Michael Pollen's book 'BOTANY OF DESIRE', plants communicate and adapt.

APPLES

Apples did not start out in this world sweet! Originating in the eastern Mediterranean area, they were imported by immigrants to the USA and were used to make a bitter cider. One Johnny Appleseed distributed various apple seeds to villages all over the Mississippi. In so doing, he mixed up good biodiversity. Apples adapted to the US environment. There would be the occasional apple sweeter than the others. Farmers cross bred and hybridised. The rest is history – they became sweeter and sweeter as humans intervened!

TULIPS

Originally from the exotic Turkish flower gardens and prized by the Sultan of Turkey, tulips believe it or not affected the world economy! The Dutch in the late 1600s traded in tulip bulbs. There evolved a famous white tulip with red stripes. This became massively sought after and its value shot up above the value of gold. Investors traded and speculated on the





next year's bulb harvest but suddenly the tulip bulbs started dying. It was discovered that the red stripe was actually a virus. The Dutch, being the biggest traders in the late 1600s – early 1700s saw their economy collapse as a result of this virus.

CANNABIS

Originating in North Africa or India, this plant, which grows virtually anywhere, was initially low in THC, the intoxicating element in Cannabis. As humans have a desire for intoxication, they helped this plant to develop higher amounts of THC, causing much controversy in the more conservative countries.





POTATOES

Potatoes originated in the Peru. The Incas cultivated many different types of potatoes, to suit different altitudes and climates in South America. The potato arrived in Ireland and rapidly became the staple food in this poor country, but only one variety existed and became prone to blight in the damp climate. 150 000 people died of famine. Then other varieties were introduced and were hybridised. With the help of massive chemical companies, they became blight-resistant. Again, the intervention of humans assisted this plant's successful development.

His passion for what he does shone through and that is one of the reasons that Vondeling has won so many awards, including their Bowwood Pinotage taking the trophy for being the top scoring Pinotage at the Michelangelo Awards in 2018.

We enjoyed the Rose, Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay, Baldrick Shiraz, Cabernet Sauvignon, and the Bowwood Pinotage as part of the tasting, and got to enjoy the Petit Blanc Chenin Blanc and Petit Rouge Merlot as the dinner wines, sponsored by Tyson Properties. The evening was completed by tasting Vondeling's dessert wine, Sweet Carolyn. An environmentally sensitive approach to farming is taken with minimal intervention during the winemaking process and a hands-on method, to produce wine with a distinct fingerprint of origin.




























R849 000. That's the starting price of the all-new Porsche Macan and it is the perfect way to introduce Porsche's latest weapon in the mid-size SUV market.

n 2017 alone Porsche sold 97 000 Macans globally and, in this day and age, it's clear to see that Macan is now more important than ever before to the German manufacturer.

At first glance, the new Macan may be mistaken for its predecessor but don't be fooled into thinking that. Porsche have refreshed the Macan in typical fashion with subtle but welcoming styling cues featuring the brand's signature full LED brake-light bar. The front fascia of the new Macan is unmistakably Porsche including updated LED headlights with the 4-point design that's trickled its way throughout the Porsche lineup. It's worth noting now that the LED lights, both front and rear, come as standard on the new Macan. Apart from a few updated bumpers and panels, the new Macan takes a dynamic styling approach - it appears to give off an athletic charm even when at a standstill.

Once seated in the cockpit of the Macan you will immediately find that it is a remarkably pleasant space to be in, with premium and solid build quality. Starting at the centre-console which is loaded with traditional buttons, as intimidating as that sounds, it is quite the opposite because once you get used to every button, knob and dial you'll quickly realise how functional and easy to navigate it is. Mercifully, however, the centre-console is not doused in pianoblack and that means fewer pesky fingerprints.

Moving on, the mammoth 10,9-inch infotainment display is so massive that, in fact, Porsche had no choice but to relocate the aircon vents below the screen. The infotainment system is a joy to operate. Its layout is simple but sophisticated, featuring navigation and Apple CarPlay/Android Auto as standard.

Porsche are particularly proud of their traditional analogue dials in the gauge-cluster, but they have somewhat kept up with the times. Flanking the speedometer and rev-counter is an indash display, not a big one but certainly the right size for functionality. Whilst it may not be the most advanced in its segment, it still has a few neat features such as displaying your navigation and tyre temperatures.

Powering the all-new Macan is a 2-litre turbo unit that has been derived from various Volkswagen Group products. It's good for an admirable 180kW and 370Nm which will see it cover the 100kph sprint in just 6,5 seconds. Although the power-plant is shared with numerous VW and Audi products, Porsche have added their own flare to it with in-house built turbos and custom software along with their marvellous 7-speed dual-clutch (PDK) transmission and all-wheel drive.

The Macan is immensely quick to respond to driver inputs with power being easily accessible for exciting overtaking. Fuel consumption is an admirable 8,1 L/100km (claimed).





Piloting the Macan is a sensation on its own. You may be fooled into thinking that it isn't a mid-sized SUV but rather a low-slung hatchback. There's no denying that the Macan punches above its weight in its segment with agile handling and an engaging drive. Every input through the steering is met with absolute precision and, when taking it through twisty mountain passes, the low centre of gravity greatly minimises body roll to deliver a rewarding driving experience. However, most owners probably won't be honing their Macan through mountain passes and I am delighted to report that even in tedious traffic conditions the Macan proves to be a luxurious and comfortable daily driver.

The Macan isn't your average crossover. It blends comfort and dynamism into an exceptionally well-rounded package. The cabin is well-built and a pleasure to interact with. Even at the base spec, the Macan features extensive standard features. It certainly does deserve the Porsche badge on its nose and at R849k it's now more tempting than ever to become a part of the Porsche family.

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n the southern Brazilian coast at Laguna, for generations, dolphins have driven shoals of mullet towards the shore where fishermen line up, knee-deep, waiting. The fishermen cannot see the fish because the water is muddy but the dolphins can - they "see" by using echo-location (sonar). The dolphins then withdraw and, slapping the water with their tails and flippers, signal for the men to cast their nets. The dolphins then snap up mullets as the fish leap clear of the water to escape.

Even more remarkable is what happens down the eastern part of Africa, from Kenya down to Mozambique, where the Greater Honeyguide, a thrush-sized bird stridently attracts humans - even if it's just a solitary passer-by. It does so by calling "Victor! Victor!" — a call frequently heard across Gauteng. (Sasol Birds of Southern Africa describes the call as "a ringing 'whitpurr' or 'Vic-tor' repeated at intervals... from a regularly used site high in a tree".)

Having attracted attention, it flies a little distance before checking that it is being followed. Then it switches to a more frantic, churring call as it waits for the honey hunters to catch up. It then guides them to a beehive. The bird has the delightful scientific name of *Indicator indicator*.

A reverse sequence also happens: the bird will respond to a specific call made by human honey-hunters implicitly asking the honeyguide to lead them to honey. When the men reach the hive, which might be deep inside a rocky fissure or tree hollow, they dig it out but make sure to leave enough comb for the birds to eat. Some believe if they fail to leave enough honeycomb then, next time, the bird will lead them to a black mamba.

The calls used by humans differ from district to district, yet the bird recognises them, which suggests that the honeyguide's response is learned, passed

down from parents to the next generation, and not instinctive.

South African ornithologist, Claire Spottiswoode, a specialist in bird behaviour at the University of Cambridge and the University of Cape Town, is the lead researcher in a project sponsored by the Max Planck Institute studying the Greater Honeyguide. She has visited sites in various parts of sub-Saharan Africa and documented several communities that encourage honeyguides.

Spottiswoode, in discussing her research in the journal, *Science*, says the honeyguide-human "mutualism" is dying out in Africa because of habitat destruction.

There are research projects across the world hoping to find ways in which we can intelligently communicate with other species. A few are concentrating on certain birds because birds, oddly enough, are the only creatures that can clearly pronounce human words. A number of owners of parrots and budgerigars believe we are but a step away from chatting to them. The voices of some members of the parrot family can be mistaken for a human voice.

But do parrots understand what they are talking about? The general opinion is, they haven't a clue. They learn by heart – sometimes surprisingly quickly – and merely regurgitate on cue.

An excellent mimic is the forest-dwelling Common Grackle or Common Hill Mynah (*Gracula religiose*) of southern Asia. It belongs to the same family as our ubiquitous urban mynahs.

Wild Indian Mynahs in a Sydney park have picked up words via domesticated mynahs in the suburbs and startle passers-by by calling, "Hello darling!"

Crows are something else. They not only mimic the human voice but have another dimension - an uncanny intelligence – far, far ahead of cats and dogs.

When one considers their bean-sized brains weigh only a few grams, their intelligence is astonishing. And of all the

corvids (crows, ravens, rooks, jackdaws, magpies and 115 other species) the New Caledonian Crow (*Corvus moneduloides*) of the South Pacific seems the brightest, though some researchers argue that Eurasia's Common Raven (*Corvus corax*), closely related to our White-necked Raven, is brighter.

According to laboratory tests by a team from the Max Planck Institute and Oxford University, the New Caledonian Crow can devise tools comprising three or even four components. That's an ability that is supposed to be unique to humans and is far ahead of the ability of chimpanzees.

In an experiment under laboratory conditions, New Caledonian crows were

confronted with scattered sticks and a few thin tubes while, a little way away, there was food inside a transparent container, its slit entrance too small for the crows. The crows worked out how to fit the sticks into the tubes to create an extendable fishing rod long enough to get at the food. On another occasion a crow found a way, at first by accident, to bend the end of a piece of wire to make a hook for getting at food.

Crows in the wild often use sticks and sometimes choose sticks with hook-like thorns for various purposes.

Apart from the skill needed for making that fishing rod, it also needed planning. The birds acted in a "seemingly purposive manner" said lead ornithologist at the Max Planck Institute, Auguste von Bayern, "because as soon as the tool was complete, the birds went straight to the food. It revealed cognitive thinking far ahead of mammals."

It was the first time a compound tool construction, using more than two parts, had been observed in an animal other than a human.

Some corvid brains contain about 2 billion neurons — neurons being the basic working units of the brain. That's four times as many as a dog's brain and eight times as many as a cat's. (The average human's brain has 86 billion.)

But can corvids, with their remarkable brains, ever intelligently talk with us? It is almost impossible to imagine. But so is the thought that a bird can invent a tool.

The humble starling – like its cousins, the mynahs – is also known for its intelligence





Top Tips for Introducing New Pets

ne of the questions we're most often asked is how to safely introduce a new cat or dog to the existing furfamily. Although every introduction and settling-in process will be different, depending on the individuals and household, there are some basic principles which can certainly help.

PLANNING

It isn't always possible to plan things down to the letter - pets sometimes have a way of finding us, rather than the other way around, eg. when the photo of a lonely soul on a rescue site 'speaks' to us and we just know they need to become part of our lives, or when a friend or family member emigrates or passes away and we step in to provide a home for their pets, etc. However, unforeseen circumstances aside, the following points can make things easier:

- If you have a male pet, introduce a female, and vice versa.
- Avoid introducing cats into a dog family unless you are sure the dogs

- are cat-friendly. It's always preferable to introduce new dogs to established cat/s, rather than the other way around.
- Think carefully about the nature of the breeds of animals involved. Fighting breeds, like Pitbulls, Bull Terriers and Staffies, may have a problem with other dogs coming into their space and are also likely to be a danger to cats unless they have been brought up with them. Some hunting breeds like Greyhounds, Whippets, Dachshunds, Jack Russells and Fox Terriers, are also generally not an ideal mix with cats, as they are bred to chase and kill animals which look and behave a lot like cats.
- Consider size and age a boisterous, large breed puppy or a kitten with no 'off switch' might turn into an absolute nightmare for a small or fragile older pet.
- Ensure that all pets are sterilised, or will be as soon as they reach sexual maturity (6 months). Hormones can be a real trigger of disharmony, amongst both intact males and females, and this is effectively dealt with through sterilisation.

NEUTRAL GROUND

When introducing new dogs, ALWAYS do so in neutral territory like a fencedoff park, someone else's pet-free home or the exercise area at a welfare or dog-training centre. With neither party having a vested interest in 'protecting their domain' from newcomers, you will get a good feel of whether or not the dogs have the potential to bond. Animals are like humans in that they may really like someone else's vibe and want to be friends - or they might feel that the other rubs them up the wrong way entirely. This first meeting will be a great indicator of things to come. If the animals don't get on, it would be best to abandon the idea. Dissention will only escalate once the new animal is brought into the home territory of the existing pet/s, and trying to push the animals on one another will create a stressful and potentially dangerous situation for all of them, as well as for you and your family. (In a follow-up article, we will cover the techniques to ensure success in this allimportant first introduction.)

It's not practical to introduce cats in this way, due to flight risks, but see our other points below for tips on introducing them successfully within the home.

POSITIVE REINFORCEMENT

Whatever the circumstances, the VITAL piece of the puzzle is ensuring that existing pets don't feel threatened by the arrival of a new animal. In fact, they need to feel the opposite. The newcomer must be a good thing to have around. The easiest way to achieve this is through positive reinforcement via praise and treats. It may be our natural instinct to focus on the new animal, as we feel it

needs extra care and support to settle into its new environment – especially in the case of young animals and rescues (who may have health or behavioural issues). However, if we allow our existing fur-family to see us suddenly focusing on another pet whom they see as a threat to their share of your attention, food and other resources such as treats, sleeping areas and toys, we will only succeed in creating animosity and resentment and set the new animal up to be bullied.

As counter-intuitive as it seems, if we ignore the new pet in the presence of the others, while praising them, giving treats and ensuring that they feel secure in their position in the home and in our affections, we short-circuit all the angst and facilitate a much smoother acceptance of the newbie. Make sure that the new pet does not have free access to the existing pet's favourite resting places, toys and food.

Ensure that the existing pets are greeted and fussed over first and that any special attention given to the new pet, such as cuddling and coo-ing takes place away from the others. Maybe have the kids take the rest of the family out for a walk, or arrange some special play time with the cats in a separate room, while someone feeds the pup/kitten or enjoys bonding time with the new arrival.

FEEDING

Mealtimes are pivotal points in animals' hierarchical structure and the way that they're managed by us can make or break an introductory process. If special feeding is required for the newcomer, this needs to happen away from the established fur-family. They can't be seen to have a special fuss made of them, as this will most certainly 'ruffle feathers'.

Until you are sure that everyone gets along, feed all the pets together with the newbie separated by a sliding door or baby gate - this allows them to be part of the proceedings, but not seen as a threat. It also prevents any scuffles from breaking out if the new furry ventures near someone else's bowl. Feed in this way until you are 100% sure that the animals have accepted one another. It works very well for cats too - you can even feed them in separate rooms with a closed door between them. Gradually move the bowls on either side closer and closer to the door until they are eating right next to one another, separated only by the door. Then open the door and use







a baby gate instead - or the glass sliding door is also a perfect option.

Always ensure that the top-dog or the most established member receives his or her food first and the new animal, last.

SUPERVISION

No matter how accommodating your existing fur-family may seem towards the newcomer, safety for all must be the top priority. Until you are convinced that all the animals are completely comfortable around one another, do not risk leaving them alone unattended. If you're not familiar with animal body language, resources abound on the internet and these will enable you to quickly judge if any of your animals is feeling uncomfortable, threatened, or overwhelmed. In this case, you need to intervene quickly and appropriately. (Our follow-up article will provide more detail on this).

Once they are all socialising happily while you're away at work, continue to observe the Safety First rule and avoid leaving treats or toys out that may become 'bones of contention' in your absence. Dogs in particular use 'resources' as a means to feel comfortable in their environment and to exert dominance over other members of the group, so always expect food, toys, territory and YOUR ATTENTION

to be potential catalysts for aggression between established fur-family members and new arrivals, and be vigilant for signs of disharmony between individuals.

When introducing cats and dogs for the first time, ensure that the cats are in carriers and the dogs on leads for everyone's safety. Place the cats higher than the dogs so that they don't feel intimidated by their size. Allow them to sniff each other in this controlled environment and get used to one another's presence. Reinforce calm behaviour with treats for both the cats and the dogs.

CROSS-SCENTING

A technique that works nicely with cats is called cross-scenting. Initially you'll be keeping your new kitty in a separate room for safety, so try placing some of the established cats' blankets/beds into the newcomer's room and take any blankets or covers that he or she has been sleeping on back to where the established cats are. This allows them to get used to each other's smells without the shock of a face-to-face meeting. You might find they all start sleeping on each other's blankets and you can then swap them back. This helps reinforce that they are all part of the same family group. You can even transfer scents directly

from one cat to another, by rubbing your hands (ever-so-slightly damp with water) along the body of one cat and then stroking the other. Repeat later the other way around, from Cat 2 to Cat 1. This is pretty much what cats are doing when they nuzzle faces or rub their bodies against other cats or their humans: they're scent-marking each other and us!

CALMING PRODUCTS

Pheromone-based calming products like the Feliway and Adaptil range (CEVA) can be exceptionally helpful in the process of introducing pets to each other or, indeed, to any new situation. The 'pheromones' are laboratory-formulated substances that mimic the natural pheromones given off by animals to ensure that they feel comfortable in their environment. Pheromones are the scents that are applied when cats rub items with their faces or bodies, scratch mark, or when they spray, and when dogs lift their legs to urine mark their territory.



Adaptil collars can help dogs feel calm and at ease in an unfamiliar situation and you can use the spray product on your hands when interacting with both the new dog and the existing dogs in the home.

Feliway Diffusers can used verv successfully durina cat-tocat introductions, as the feel-good pheromones help all cats to feel 'at home' in their environment, eliminating the need to scratch mark, spray or fight each other. The Feliway Spray can also be applied to strategic points like bedding, a cat carrier, etc. to help the new cat feel like he belongs - or sprayed on your hands to put him at ease when you handle him. Anxious animals that meet each other will be defensive and reactive, which will prevent a positive introduction. Create as calm an environment as possible: calm and observant humans, (no raised voices, fussing over the pets, excited children running about) and ensure that each animal feels as safe as possible.


ASK THE EXPERTS

If you don't feel confident enough to facilitate a positive introduction, or despite all your efforts in applying the above pointers, you're still struggling to get all the members of the fur-family, both 'new' and 'old', to get along and accept one another, do yourself a favour and reach out to an accredited animal behaviourist. These wonderful people



have spent plenty of time studying the finer nuances of how animals interact and have a deep understanding of the factors that influence how pets feel and behave in different circumstances. They will give you reliable advice on some changes to make to ensure that all your animals feel comfortable, and they will also be honest with you if the mix of 'fursonalities' is one that just isn't going to work. Enlisting the help of an expert may prevent an unfortunate tragedy, and, at the very least, will equip you with some new 'animal whispering' skills. 

CONQUERING PEAS

s a card-carrying member of Densa, the association I founded for those too dumb for Mensa, I admit to being nervous when talking with Mensans.
