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



### Owl House Gets New Residents




We installed the owl houses on the Estate a few years back and nothing happened until last week. Wonderful news! The owls hatched and there are two chicks!

### PLEASE DON'T KILL US WITH BREAD!



Bread is actually a danger to ducks and water birds. It causes Angel Wing which can make our feathers grow too quickly. This strains our muscles and can stop us flying.





Bread is bad for our water environment. It rots, and pollutes the water. This allows bacteria to grow and encourages rats. It causes algal bloom which gets into our lungs and kills us birds.

If you want to feed us we like lettuce, peas and sweetcorn.

### **GARDENING**

### Good day Residents,

Herewith an explanation of what is currently underway in the Estate. Also, what to look forward to when we have finished.

There are proportional excavations in the river beds that Powergate (appointed contractors) are working on. A big machine is on-site doing this work. This is due to the fact that a normal TLB can't do the work. It gets stuck in the mud and tumbles over.

Obviously, we can't do these excavations by hand, as it will take forever. The silt build-up has become such a problem that flooding and damage is of a regular occurrence.

Now, there is a lot of wet mud heaped onto either side of the river bed. It is like sludge. This has to dry out first in order for the people to return to work on this area again. Thus, they move on towards another section to excavate.

We realise it looks terrible. Please be patient. As the soil dries out, workers move back to these areas. Most of the soil will be taken away, the soil then gets worked down/smoothed out, to a suitable gradient, all rubble is removed and the rocks are rolled back into the river bed to act as water breakers.

Rock gabions are then installed across the river bed. These gabions slow down water flow and act as silt catchers. As Powergate finish off an area, the Engineer comes in and does his inspection before he signs off on that area. We then have to do the rehabilitation of that specific area.

A hessian-like fabric called Geojute is cut into sections specific to that area. This fabric is bio-degradable, thus will degrade over time. The reason we use this fabric is to hold down the soil till plant roots have established and so control soil erosion better.

This fabric is nailed down over these gradient slopes on either side of the river beds. We then cut cross sections into this fabric where suitable plants will be planted.

These plants have to be low maintenance, like muddy conditions, have a fairly strong side root system and grow fairly quickly.

### Some examples of plants we will use:

- 1. Zantedeschia Arum lily
- 2. Chondropetalum Cape thatch grass
- 3. Salvia Sage
- 4. Plumbago Leadworts
- 5. Dietes Wild iris
- 6. Leucospermum Pincushions
- 7. Different tree spp.

So, at the end of the day we will have bigger channels for the flow of water, worked down embankments planted with flowering shrubs, grasses and trees.









### **GARDENING**

I have to mention that this project will not be finished as the contractors are closing for December.

However, it will be finished early next year with the minimum disruption and mess. Some heavy excavations will have to be done as this is not finished yet.

We are busy doing an overall clean-up before closing of Office on 21 December 2018.

A big thank you to Don and his team for all their extra work in establishing the new gardens and assisting with the cleanup where construction took place. We had to take them off their normal gardening schedule.

I would like to thank my fellow Board members for all their patience and support in these projects.










The pathways leading up to the unit's entrance were also revamped and the gardeners were busy removing the old paving and laying new paving. The end result is truly amazing!

Let us use the festive break to relax and recharge our batteries so that when we come back in the New Year we are better individuals with the necessary energy to do better than we did this year.








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### To all our Residents,




