The Power of the Tree



he 1st of September heralded the start of spring and the start of Arbour Week, an annual celebration that dates back to Nebraska (USA) 1872. In South Africa, Arbour Day was first celebrated in 1983, and in 1999 the National Government extended the celebration of Arbour Day to Arbour Week.

This year the trees being highlighted are: Common: Blossom Tree or Keurboom (Virgilia oroboides).
Rare: Cross-Berry or Kruisbessie (Grewia occidentalis).
Powder-puff Tree or Poeierkwasboom (Barringtonia racemosa).

Hundreds of thousands of trees will be planted. However, most of these will not be planted because of their natural beauty or because of our need to restore our forests. Rather, they will be planted as part of our collective and ongoing efforts to counter the impacts of climate change.

Every tree will have an impact. In KZN, one indigenous tree will sequester around 250kg of CO₂ over 20 years, or 12kg per annum. Wildlands, in partnership with the KZN Government

and eThekwini Metro, will plant over 500 000 trees this coming year, supporting the sequestration of over 6 000 tons of CO₂ per annum.

However, this is a fraction of the impact required to slow and reverse climate change. South Africans collectively emit over 436 million tons of CO₂ per annum, placing us 13th in the global standing of CO₂ emitters. To offset this impact, we'd need to plant over 36 billion trees per annum! So why bother?

I believe that every tree planted will not only make its own small contribution, but is symbolic of our growing consciousness and commitment to addressing the challenges of climate change.

Now, many will argue "too little, too late"! There are also legions of "tree" sceptics, who rightfully argue that we won't stop climate change by planting trees. They're right, it is going to take a whole lot more! But, South Africa has never seen environmental mobilisation on the current scale.

This was demonstrated by a historic event, when over 25 000 Zulu maidens converged in Nongoma for the annual

Royal Reed Dance Festival, Umkhosi woMhlanga. This year, a new element was incorporated into the Festival, namely the planting of an indigenous tree by each maiden.

This initiative was supported by the National Department of Environment affairs as part of their pre-COP 17 activities, and was simply one example of a massive mobilization of green action across the country. The maidens were explained the significance of the tree that they have planted, that their tree is symbolic of the need for them to become custodians of our natural resources and ambassadors for our planet. This is also true for every other South African who plants a tree during and after Arbour Week.

Imagine if every South African did plant a tree. That would be over 50 million trees per annum. Still a long way from the 36 billion required, but a massive statement of intent.

A Sunday afternoon walk in Boardwalk Meander Estate

esterday afternoon I was standing outside in my garden, and just suddenly decided to walk over to the dam. I must admit that I haven't been walking a lot in the Estate lately, and it was the first time in a few weeks I got the chance to just stroll down to the dam. A quick tenminute walk, I thought...

Here's my story.

As I was walking I noticed all the new green leaves on the Sweet Thorn (Soetdoring) and River Bushwillow (Rivier Vaderlands Wilg) trees next to the dam. The Red Bishops (Rooi Vinke) chasing each other in the reeds.

As I stopped next to the dam, I suddenly remembered that I heard the beautiful "boo-boo-boo-boo-boo-boo-bo-bo" of the Burchell's Coucal (Gewone Vleiloerie) earlier that morning. A bird a lot of people call the Rainbird (Reënvoël).

Standing there next to the dam looking up into the sky, there were Swallows (Swaeltjies) floating around in the wind and some clouds dancing past me – carrying with them the promise and smell of rain.

For some reason my heart was suddenly filled with nostalgia. I couldn't help myself but to just start walking further and further down the pathway...

At the bird hide two stunning Spoonbills (Lepelaars) were going

about their business of trying to catch food in the shallow water, with the Egyptian geese (Kolganse) and Yellow Billed Ducks (Geelbek eende) relaxing next to the water on the grass.

The noise of all the Vinches (Vinke) in the reeds was almost deafening.

Past the reeds something caught my eye in the shallow water, and I walked closer to investigate. It was a huge Blue Tilapia (Bloukurper). Silently waiting just under the surface next to the grass, for an insuspecting insect. I started moving on.

Just before the dam wall I was surprised by a pair of Small Grebes (Klein dobbertjies) and a Red-knobbed Coot (Bleshoender), both busy feeding small chicks. Every now and then diving under the water, chasing each other.

Behind the big dam wall I passed some Helmeted Guinea fowl (Tarentale), resting under the trees. Warning each other of my presence with their rattling "kek-kek-kek-kek-krrrrrr" as I walked by.

At the next dam a sad, but typically African, dry season scene awaited me. The water level in the dam was very low and in the small pond left, a few Barbel (Babers) were gliding over each. Coming up for air every few seconds from the muddy water. Rain coming soon, their only chance of survival...

A few hundred metres further downstream, a pleasant smell



brought me to a standstill. An almost Jasmine-like smell. I looked around me and realized that the Common Hook Thorn Trees (Gewone Haakdorings) were all in full bloom. Their creamy white flowers hung in bunches and appeared amazing against the backdrop of the water with the dam behind it. I walked closer and stood in the middle of the branches full of flowers. A few minutes went by as I just smelled the sweet fragrance...

My next stop was the small Mulberry tree (Moerbei boom) next to the pathway. On my arrival a few Grey Louries (Kwêvoëls) flew out of the tree, where they were busy having a feast. Luckily they missed a few ripe ones. As I was standing under the tree picking the purple ones out, my mind was wondering back to my childhood days on the farm. I remembered the two huge "Moerbei bome" on the farm. How many hours I spent climbing around in them kaalvoet - eating so many berries that I could hardly walk. Sometimes falling asleep on one of the branches. The smell of the leaves and berries - still fresh in my mind... And later in the evening my mother struggling to get my purple-stained feet and clothes washed clean.

The loud "fraaank" of a Grey Heron (Grys Reier) flying past me, brought me back to reality.

At the last dam on the pathway I sat down next to the water and I took off my shoes. A Blacksmith Plover

Wildlife

(Bontkiewiet) calling constantly behind me, sounding like a hammer on an anvil. In front of me in the shallow water a big crab was busy eating a dead fish. Strangely beautiful. I felt the wind blowing over my feet.

The cars driving past the iron fence on the other side in Old Farm road caught my eyes. I suddenly realised that I was in the city.

I saw the sun low on the horizon. I had to get home.



Security

Security: A form of protection where a separation is created between the assets and the threats

Attending events organized by the Estate is also welcomed as Residents get the opportunity to discuss matters on an informal basis and these ideas can be used to better our service.

Operations

- Two bicycles are also being used to do patrols, together with foot patrols.
- Our clocking system is being monitored and we are confident that it is working well.
- Patrols have been increased as an attempt to further minimize any possible incidents.

- Regular meetings with Brinant prove to be successful and they are giving us their full support.
- Vehicle patrols are done in addition to the foot patrols.

Access to the estate

We wish to inform all Residents that only the following people may enter the Estate via access procedures:

- Residents
- Domestic workers linked to residents houses
- · Gardeners linked to residents' houses
- Registered contractors
- · Estate staff and workers.

It has come to our attention that some of our neighbouring properties are using the Estate to walk, run and bring their dogs for a walk. Unfortunately this will have to be addressed as it creates a possible breach of security. Most people do have friends living in our Estate, but will have to make use of the existing entry rules and regulations. A formal letter regarding this issue will be sent out from the Board to notify and explain it. Please note we are not saying people cannot use the Estate if they have access to the Estate like any other visitors. The procedure is clear: Visitors call from the gate via our ClickOn system and a Resident can open the gate for their vehicle to drive in. No pedestrians can gain access via the ClickOn system and therefore they will have to drive into the Estate. Parking bays at the Office can be used to simplify the process.

We hope that everyone will understand that we cannot have non-residents gain access to our Estate at free will. The matter might be sensitive, but it was discussed at trustee level and will be implemented.
