

5 WAYS TO REDUCE YOUR WINTER ELECTRIC BILL

The cold, wet winter weather often translates into more nights spent at home, which can cause electricity bills to skyrocket. Most of us already live according to strict budgets, so finding ways to reduce our electricity consumption during this season would be ideal. Not to mention that a lowered electric bill is also a more environmentally responsible way of living, which is something we should all be striving toward.

Of course, following those dark days of load shedding (excuse the pun) in 2015, everybody should be well aware of the obvious electricity savers, such as unplugging all of your appliances when they're not in use, filling your washing

machines and dishwashers with a full (not half) load before switching them on, making use of geyser blankets, and installing ceiling insulation for heating and cooling purposes. But, there are loads of other subtle tricks homeowners can try in an effort to lower the meter reading at the end of the month:

1) Unplug in Bulk

Plug your appliances into a power strip. That way you only have to unplug one device to prevent all of your appliances from drawing a phantom charge from the power socket.

2) Dust your Lightbulbs

Dust on the lightbulbs in your lamps is another "phantom" electricity thief. The dustier your lightbulbs, the less light they provide, which means that you are more likely to switch on additional lights in order to brighten the space – especially during Winter when the evenings and mornings get darker earlier.

3) Shop for Groceries Wisely

Freezers and refrigerators use less electricity when filled to their recommended capacities. Each item over the recommended capacity will increase electricity usage by between 10-20%. A similar effect occurs when these appliances are too empty. Homeowners should consider the needs of their household carefully before purchasing a fridge and freezer.

4) Empty Vacuums Cleaner Bags

Vacuum cleaners draw a lot more electricity when the dust bag is full, which is why it is best to empty the bag every time you use it.

5) Wash on a Cold Cycle

Set your washing machine to a cold cycle. As a bonus, you do not need to separate your lights and darks because the cold water is less likely to make the colours run.

As a final trick, why not spend a little less time in front of their screens this winter and more time engaging with their loved ones instead? Board games and conversations are a great way to stay entertained on rainy days without using any electricity.

Enjoy winter and remember it is the perfect time to do your garden pruning and painting work to tidy up your property!

New high-definition Smart Surveillance system







24/7 Security Services is in the process of implementing a new high-definition Smart Surveillance system at Fourways Gardens Estate (FWG). The system will revolutionise the conventional electronic estate security.

When compared to conventional CCTV systems, the new electronic security system is a pro-active means to secure the access, egress, internal and perimeter points of FWG. Each component of the system has been strategically designed to detect specific parameters and draw the attention of the Control Room operator to that particular camera and location – overall increasing perimeter protection and efficiency.

Opposed to conventional cameras that require light to generate images, the

new cameras are incredibly effective in poor weather conditions and low-light environments. The intelligent analytics have been configured to detect movement along the sidewalks and generate alarms in the Control Room as the object/s approaches the perimeter. These alarms are immediately verified, and accurate information relayed to the relevant response personnel.

Opposed to conventional control room telemetry (FWG), CCTV operators will process information generated from the analytic detection in the form of events/ activations. The Control Room will have the ability to react to a specific threat with the newly integrated public-address audio system, as well as investigate suspicious activity with motorised Pan

Tilt and Zoom cameras.

Advance license plate recognition (LPR) systems have been implemented at the main access, egress and on the interleading traffic circle. Each vehicle registration number will be referenced to a central database and will alert the Control Room of any suspicious registration plates.

To increase the effectiveness of the new Smart Surveillance system, the Control Room will be undergoing a revamp and a number of technical modifications will ensure that it evolves into an event-based pro-active Command Centre.

Direct remote support and redundancy can be offered to the Control Room operator directly from 24/7 Security's Central Command Centre.



MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Richard Eltringham, a Fourways Gardens resident, Dainfern College Matriculant and Tuks BCom Marketing Management graduate has an inspiring story to tell.

After a year in a Postgraduate Digital Marketing Internship at an IT company, Richard decided to pursue something a little different with his girlfriend, Robyn Mays, who is also a Tuks Graduate. This decision is off the beaten track usually taken by people their age: a year off to volunteer around South Africa and Africa!

"We didn't want to go to an organisation to do what a typical volunteer would do. We wanted to volunteer our skills in order to make a difference. It was important that what we did was sustainable. This was going to be an experience where we could help organisations that could benefit from our skills and where we could learn from the incredible

people who dedicate their lives to helping anyone and anything but themselves," Richard said.

The only problem was how to fund the year. Their solution was freelancing their digital marketing, fundraising, graphic design, and business management skills to whoever needed them. A lot of the work they did started with offering free services to NPOs as a way to gain exposure and experience.

"For anyone wanting to start out in freelancing, this is a great way to build a portfolio while helping many people who would really appreciate your skills," they say.


What started as freelancing turned into a vision for a business – if they could run a company that offered their digital marketing and business management consulting services, they would be able to earn enough money to sustain their volunteering.

This is how Digital Butter was founded. Digital Butter is a digital marketing company that funds their volunteering work and pro bono work for non-profits. They say, "Our agenda extends beyond a single campaign" and that people are at the centre of everything they do — in the business and non-profit world. They have thus far helped 11 non-profits and have just returned from working at a non-profit in Hibberdene, KZN called Thanda. "What has been incredible to see is that social responsibility is no longer just a trend, but a necessity of any sustainable business," they say.

Thanda is an organisation that helps the rural community of Mtwalume using four core Programmes: Early Childhood Development, After-School Education, Organic Farming, and Creative learning.







Richard and his girlfriend/business partner both worked in the NPOs marketing team for the 3 months of their stay. The experience they have gained from the 3 months in Thanda's marketing team has been invaluable. They would like to continue to spread the word about skills based volunteering.

They urge all Fourways Gardens residents to imagine the social impact that they could provide through skills-based volunteering.

"Working on the ground in a non-profit exposes you to so much more than we ever could have imagined. You are able to see the needs of an NGO from a different perspective. Non-profits need skills and expertise and so many people have the ability to provide these," Richard said.

"An easy way to explain it would be to consider the impact one would have if one painted a building for a day versus trained an employee in project management for a day. It is the famous idiom: Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime, in action.

Richard and Robyn are both currently back in Fourways and remotely working for Thanda and several other NPOs on top of all of their clients before heading down to Cape Town to help another NPO on site with their digital marketing.

FOURWAYS GARDENS GARDENING CLUB OUTING 21 JULY 2018 SAWASDEE EMPORIUM – AN ORCHID LOVER'S PARADISE



Jacques Botha gave us an insight into the care and propagation of these magnificent plants. We learned:

- The difference between Terrestrial and Epiphytic orchids and how to pot them.
- How to clean out moss from the roots and allow necessary air flow to the roots.
- Use of bark, broken clay pots or bricks or even stones as a potting medium.
- Make sure about the type of orchid you have whether it is a warm or cold growing orchid. Warmer growing orchids

must be kept inside during winter; bring them in to an area that is protected and gives them morning sun. Cooler growing orchids can be kept outside, protected against frost.

- Water orchids well with each watering allowing them to dry 80% before you water again.
- Fertilise your orchids every 4th watering.
- Too much direct sun will burn your leaves.
- How to recognise and treat pests orchids are most susceptible to, by using either a contact or systemic insecticide.
- If you need advice on your orchids, take them to Sawasdee Nursery for professional advice, no charge!!










August In the Garden

This is the month in south African gardening circles to get all of your pruning done. This is especially true for fruit trees and roses, but also any deciduous shrubs that may be in need of a trim. Remember to shred all your cutting and pop them onto the compost heap that you've almost certainly already started. Transplanting is another common theme during August as many plants are dormant and can be moved Without worrying about disturbing them. So, if you're looking for a change of scenery or just to update the overall look and feel of your garden, now is an ideal time.



AUGUST FLOWERS

Improve the view by adding colourful cheer to your garden this July. Here are a few delightful winter flowering plants you still have time to plant this month

- Calendulas
- Pansies


Cool-season edibles and annuals will now be available at your local accredited garden centre, so pop in for a culinary and colour delight. It may be chilly out there, but your garden would probably enjoy a dash of attention as much as your body would enjoy a bit of fresh air. Although it's cold, it is a very exciting time of the year with spring in the distance. Plants are starting to wake up as the days start getting longer and it is a wonderful time to get stuck into the garden.



TO DO

August is the tail - end of winter and you can start looking at soil preparation of your flower beds by adding organic compost as well as our Vermi plus (Carbon based fertilizer) which improves your soil structure and conditions it for the summer season ahead.

One must also look at scarifying your lawn by cutting it very short to remove the thatch build up. This process removes all the old dry grass and encourages new shoots to grow. Lawn dress your lawn after scarification with a good weed free lawndressing to level your lawn areas and encourage quick regrowth. Apply Vermi plus after lawn dressing.



Your quick checklist

- Fix uneven and worn out garden paths
- Paint your garden gates a new colour.
- Lavish a new coat of paint on your trusty old wheelbarrow to prevent rust.
- Have your lawnmower and weed-eater serviced.
- Sharpen [or have sharpened] all pruners, loppers and hedge cutters.
- Repair retaining walls and fill the cavities of those built with custom-made retaining black fresh soil mixed with compost and lawndressing to be ready for holding new cascading and ground covering plants.

The wine maker himself, Richard Duckitt, hosted the tasting and provided vast amounts of knowledge about the wine estate and a selection of their delightful wines. Guests tasted wines from both the Bernard Series and the Homestead Series, all of which received rave reviews.

At Bellingham they believe that great wines are made in the vineyard and that is why they source only the finest grapes and nurture them from vine to bottle. To preserve the natural fruit characteristics of individual grape cultivars, they lavish time and attention on each wine throughout the production process. They place a high premium on mouthfeel and believe in subtle oak maturation to enhance the structure and complexity of their wines. 



AWARENESS OF HEARING LOSS

o you often ask for words or sentences to be repeated because it sounds like people are mumbling or do you turn the TV louder than others would prefer? If yes, you may have a hearing loss and need to contact an Audiologist to conduct a hearing evaluation which involves a diagnostic hearing test to confirm the type and severity of hearing loss. Hearing loss can be caused due to excessive noise exposure, ear infection, wax in the ear or the aging process known as presbycusis. Even medical conditions such as meningitis, tuberculosis, diabetes or malaria may also cause hearing loss. But don't despair, help is available!

Hearing loss is a "silent problem", unlike vision. Glasses is considered a cool fashion accessory, unlike hearing aids which is usually associated with stigma and myths even though both hearing, and vision are affected by age. There are benefits of wearing hearing aids sooner than later, it will slow down the deterioration of a hearing loss and allow you to adapt easier, enjoying better quality of life and improved communication and socialization. The diagnosis of sensorineural hearing loss is often met with viewpoints such as, "My hearing is not that bad", "My hearing is still good for my age" or "I am too young for hearing aids", which delays intervention. Research suggests that hearing aid wearers wait on average between 7 and 10 years before seeking help for hearing loss.

Successful intervention for hearing loss will depend on making hearing screenings a routine part of medical care. Everyone needs a diagnostic hearing test on a regular basis to provide a baseline to measure changes in our hearing. Without such a baseline, it becomes difficult to evaluate the impact of many things that may affect hearing — from chronic diseases like diabetes to medical treatments like chemotherapy to accidents. Without a diagnostic test on record, it can be difficult to prove that hearing changed.



Finding a way to deal with your hearing loss can be a challenge but don't despair, help is available. Modern hearing aids offer natural sound quality and are small stylish and discreet and has more processing power than a computer. Wearing a hearing aid for the first time may feel overwhelming. However, the Audiologist will work with you to set the instrument and ensure your comfort. Allow yourself time to adapt and re – discover the new world of sound that you have been missing.



SAYING GOODBYE... Surviving the passing of your fur child

Our pets become members of our family from the moment we welcome them into our home. We build a connection with them that can be every bit as strong as those we share with our human loved ones. One of the very few drawbacks about having pets is that we will generally outlive them and have to cope with their loss.




here is nothing that anyone can do or say to lessen that grief, but our hope is that what we share here will help prepare you for the day that you have to say goodbye, and offer some suggestions on how to navigate your loss.

Euthanasia – what to expect.

We cannot prepare ourselves for the accidental or unexpected death of a pet, which brings with it shock and disbelief. Many times however, we as pet parents will be faced with a difficult decision that we don't encounter when a human family member is terminally ill: the option to euthanase our pet and thereby end its suffering sooner than nature would allow. Understanding your options and the process involved when a pet is "put to sleep" can help you prepare yourself and know how best to support your furry loved one, yourself and the rest of your family through the experience.

Your veterinarian understands, better than most, the complex emotions and the challenges involved in making the best decision for your pet. They



will always allow for a pre-euthanasia consultation to answer all your questions and to give you an honest assessment of the likelihood of your pet living a meaningful life in the future, or its current quality of life. No vet will ever make the final decision for you (unless the pet is deemed to be suffering extremely and unnecessarily, in which case they have an ethical obligation to end an animal's suffering). However, they will guide you to the extent that you involve them. Speak to your pet's health care team — as pet parents themselves they know the pain

of loss first hand, and they want to help you in any way they can.

Your veterinary team will most likely be prepared to go out of their way to make this your personal time with your pet. Let them know if you have specific wishes with regards to the venue or time, so that they can take care of everyone involved.

You may choose to remain with your pet throughout the process, to offer comfort and reassurance, and you will always be afforded some time alone with him or her afterwards. That said, for some pet parents it's just too overwhelming to stay, and it is completely okay to leave your furry loved-one in the caring and capable hands of your vet after saying your goodbyes.

Some veterinary practices offer the option of euthanasing a frail pet in the comfort and privacy of your own home. If this is your wish, discuss it with the clinic staff ahead of time so that they can make the necessary arrangements.

If your pet is elderly or ill, start

having these conversations with your veterinary team and put some plans in place to reduce as much of the stress as possible when the time comes.

How will I know it's 'Time'?

Deciding to put a beloved pet to sleep is never going to be easy, regardless of how old or sick he or she may be. We all worry that we'll push our pets beyond the point where they can't manage anymore because we want to hold onto them for as long as possible. Or that we'll make the decision too early and rob them of a few extra weeks or months with their family. The following guidelines from our veterinarian may help you reach a decision that you can be as comfortable with as possible.


You know your pet the best: what makes him happy, how he shows his enjoyment of life and what routines and activities demonstrate his positive engagement with his family and other pets. For instance: running to the gate to greet visitors, playing favourite games, purring like a tractor-engine, tail-wagging, interacting with family members, eating well, and the ability to maintain personal hygiene. Pets become very stressed about losing their dignity and especially the control of their bodily functions.

Make a mental note of these behaviours while your pet is still healthy and then decide, based on the absence of these, when the point is reached that your fur baby is no longer enjoying a decent quality of life. As pet guardians, we should consider quality over quantity when it comes to their lives; now more than ever, medical advances allow us to extend our animals' lives beyond what might otherwise have been possible. It falls to us to balance our ability to have our beloved pets live longer, with the responsibility not to extend suffering if there is no prospect of a meaningful recovery. It's truly a privilege to be able to make a decision to spare our furry loved ones pain, suffering and loss of dignity.

And afterwards?

Municipal by-laws generally don't allow pets to be buried on your property, and in Johannesburg, there is a professional pet crematorium that provides a service to all veterinary hospitals, and













can also collect your pet after a home euthanasia (or unexpected death).

In our personal experience after many years in the veterinary industry, these facilities are absolutely outstanding and their operations based firmly on dignity and respect. Before your pet is put to sleep, your vet will discuss the options available to you: a communal cremation, a private cremation with the return of your pet's ashes, a memorial plaque at a garden of remembrance, or the possibility of creating a lifegem from your pet's ashes, and the associated costs. You may want to bring along a favourite toy, blanket or other meaningful items to be cremated with your pet - in as far as possible, every effort will be made to fulfil your wishes in this regard. You may also arrange to attend your pet's cremation. If you've opted for return of ashes, these will generally arrive within a week. Some owners bury or scatter the ashes in the pet's favourite spot in the garden, perhaps plant something beautiful there or create another form of memorial. Any form of remembering your beloved pet will greatly help you and your family come to terms with his loss. This is also a special way of assisting children to process what may be their first encounter with death.

How will I cope?

The loss of a pet can have the same impact as the loss of a person, and it follows the same stages of grief. Everyone experiences a very personal bereavement and there is no right or wrong in our feelings, or in how long we take to grieve.

Take some time out from work, create

space for yourself, have conversations with your pet ... whatever you need to help you feel okay. There is no script and no-one can tell you when it's time to "get over it". Seek out the company of fellow animal-lovers who understand what you're going through and won't contribute ridiculous comments like "But it's just a cat!" or "Why don't you just get another dog?"

There are also dedicated pet memorial websites where you can share the memory of your pet, which gives many pet parents comfort.

In some cases the remaining pets in the family may also be suffering the loss and need support. You may find them huddled on the bed of the pet who passed, or that they begin sitting in his favourite place in the garden. They

could be subdued and lose their appetite for a while. Some will "ask" you to help them look for their missing friend by pawing at cupboard doors, trying to get behind the bed or the fridge, or popping out to the garden every now and then to check that he hasn't perhaps turned up. If you have other fur kids, give them lots of attention and reassurance at this time, regardless of how low you're feeling – you'll find this contact and the shared activities will help everyone. It's been said that grief is merely love with no place to go, so be sure to pour out that love to those close to you.

Young children who haven't yet formed a concept of the finality of death will process the passing of pets differently, based on their age. There are many helpful resources online to assist parents.

Should I get another pet?

Nobody can tell you when it's right to get another pet: whether you should do so immediately, or give yourself some time. This is something only you and your family can decide. It can be healing to focus on the needs of another animal - a helpless kitten, a rescue dog or whatever special furry being calls to you and needs your TLC. But you may also feel that you need to fully grieve your pet first, before considering making space in your heart for another. Some people never get another pet, given the pain their loss caused them. But we hope that your grief will not prevent you from opening your home and heart so that another fur baby can experience your love and care. It may help to imagine what the deceased pet would want for you.

We will miss and always remember the furry companions that have shown us so much unconditional love and enhanced our lives in so many ways. Perhaps the fact that they are only with us for a short time should be encouragement enough to make every moment count. Make each day a special one with your dog or cat – take them places, spoil them, expand their horizons and give them loads of hugs. They repay in kind beyond our wildest imaginings and leave us with a lifetime of wonderful memories.

omewhere north of Ceres in the Western Cape the Karoo begins. The veld becomes coarse, stunted, and brittle underfoot. Our guide, Vincent Ward of Birding Africa based in Cape Town, said: "This is the Amazon jungle compared with where we are going."

We emerged from the dry Warm Bokkeveld mountains and took the R355, kicking up a dust trail which remained hanging over the roadside. Across the wide flat plain I doubt there was a plant within sight that grew higher than my knee. There were plenty of low-growing succulents and bleached, wiry plants sprouting from the red sand surface.

We were now in the Tankwa Karoo, an alien world to most South Africans; a semi-desert within the Karoo semi-desert, but even drier. Its annual rainfall equals about as much as the Highveld receives in a couple of thunderstorms and even then the rain runs off the brick-hard earth, hardly penetrating to root level.

We were only able to spend two days in the Tankwa before returning to Gauteng and were looking for three rare bird species though I had long wanted to see this region for another reason. Let me go back to 1974. I was involved in organising a national conference on the future of the Karoo. It was said at the time to take up a third of South Africa's 1,1-million km² and was spreading to the north and east. It was feared it would reach the Vaal by year 2000. We environmentalists were all a bit pessimistic in those days.

I had grown to love the Karoo and felt it to be sadly underrated, under-researched and under-conserved. My old mentor, TC Robertson of the National Veldtrust, doyen among the nation's new wave of campaigning ecologists, was still around and through him my fascination for the Karoo had grown.

So many memories came back to me as Mary and I emerged from the Warm Bokkeveld and found ourselves confronted by a vast, flat landscape, with a scattering of kopjes resembling heaps of rocks. This was the Tankwa basin, framed by mountains rendered hazy and blue by distance. It no longer felt like South Africa.

The rain clouds that drift in from the Atlantic come tantalisingly close to the Tankwa only to be wrung dry as they hit the western mountains. The now moistureless westerlies become heated as

they pass over the Tankwa to desiccate the Great Karoo whose hot dry breath then penetrates north and east.

As a result, the soetdoringboom (then known as *Acacia karoo* but recently renamed *Vachellia karoo*) – precursor of the semi-desert, has been advancing further and further eastwards. Today, it is the most widespread tree in South Africa.

Mitch Reardon's new book, Wild Karoo (see review) says the Karoo now covers 60 percent of South Africa, though I think this is partly due to an adjustment in ecological definitions.

The R355, the longest and loneliest dirt road in South Africa, serves Calvinia, the Tankwa Karoo National Park, and Sutherland. We encountered precious little traffic and no infrastructure at all except for the Padstal – an ugly, tasteless, crazy collection of unplanned ramshackle buildings painted in lavatorial green. We liked it.

It was Saturday and the Padstal was busy. A wondrous variety of ancient, dusty vehicles was parked untidily around it, a cart

pulled by two donkeys among them. What appeared to be mostly farming people (from goodness knows where), were enjoying a noon-day beer and even an impromptu dance to a local music ensemble. Weathered horns from kudu and black wildebeest decorated the eaves.

The roofless bar served a special pink gin as well as something called 'skaap tjoppie'. Nearby, a busy kitchen dispensed hot meals seven days a week, all day. A church service is held every Sunday.

An ancient, blue eviscerated car has been planted, upright, its front upwards for reasons I forgot to ask.

The Padstal – an oasis of geniality - is owned and run by Hein and Susan Lange, a friendly couple whose cluttered shop sells anything from banjo strings to tyre repair kits, an explosive home-made ginger beer and lollipops. There's even a play park for children and friendly animals around.

We drove on to some low hills and picked our way up a slope among small, sharp rocks and succulents that were entirely strange to us. The aspect was vast and utterly silent. To the east were the distant Roggeveld Mountains, barely visible to the north the Koue Bokkeveld, to the west the Cederberg and far to the south the Cape fold mountains.

We spent the night in a valley off the R355 at an isolated guest farm called Hartnekskloof. It was dusk and cold, all the same we walked along an interesting bone dry river cutting called Skitterykloof (glittering ravine) looking for birds but were grateful to get to Hartnekskloof's warm hearth for a pre-prandial drink. Dinner was served with a touching and justified pride. Our accommodation was in newly-built wooden huts incongruously furnished in 1920s style.

In retrospect, we should have given ourselves time to go further north to the Tankwa National Park. The reserve, twice the size of our nearest large game reserve, the Pilanesberg, is rich in wildlife and its bird list includes some rare species.

It was good to hear that, on the advice of botanists, the park has been expanded five times since it was established in the 1980s – expanded because scientists are discovering the richness of the Tankwa's unique but under-researched vegetation and the increasing international interest in *flora Capensis*.



WILD KAROO

Written by Mitch Reardon. Published by Struik Nature. Reviewed by James Clarke.



oday there are more than 1 million springbok in the Great and Little Karoo and, possibly, as many outside. But over the previous several decades, the future of South Africa's most famous gazelle was cause for great concern.

Before the dawn of the 20th century migrations of springbok had, at infrequent intervals, criss-crossed the country in swarms. Sometimes their numbers filled landscapes kilometres across and up the sides of the hills.

The government even dished out rifles and ammunition to farmers who devised strategies worthy of a full-scale war - which is what it was, for the tides of springbok would, locust like, denude the fields of every blade of grass and crops. These spectacular migrations, climatically-driven, ended late in the 19th

century – then the numbers crashed and there was real concern for the species' survival. In 1961 the springbok population in the Karoo was down to 96 000.

The saga of the springbok makes riveting reading and takes up 16 pages of Mitch Reardon's 224-page book which I believe is one of the best written, informative and just plain enjoyable of all the South African natural history books I've read in the past 60 years of reviewing such books.

There's a lot of soul in this book, which tries to give a holistic picture but succeeds rather in describing the complexities of a unique piece of Africa under-appreciated by most of us even though it takes up 60 percent of South Africa.

The book focuses on:

Local nature conservation in all its facets;

- The game, large and small some recently reintroduced – plus birds, reptiles and invertebrates;
- The unique, arid-adapted flora;
- The landscape and geology;
- The history and lifestyle of the people who have made a home here;
- Plans to combine public and private protected land to create wildlife corridors between isolated parks, reestablishing old migration routes and so reversing some of the effects of human settlement.

The book should inspire young scientists and nature enthusiasts to take up a mission to probe even further this biologically rich but troubled semi-desert.

It took Mitch Reardon, a former ranger and wildlife photographer, three years and 4 000 km of travel to draw much needed attention to the Great Karoo.

I'M A PSYCHIATRIST, LET ME THROUGH!

JM Coetzee, in his autobiography, Youth, asserted that happy people are not interesting.

"Better to accept the burden of unhappiness and try to turn it into something worthwhile, poetry, or music, or painting," wrote Coetzee.

I have tried all three in my lifetime – as well as trying my hand at other things such as collecting pictures of Hillary Clinton and growing spinach. None has made me happy, so I am not sure if it was working for me.

There was a Muscovite (which I thought was a kind of duck until I discovered it was somebody who lived in Moscow) named Reuben Vardanian, a psychologist, who famously stated that money is not the source of happiness. He said, "Whether you have \$20 million or \$55 million makes no difference to your level of happiness".

I am sure this is true. I would be happy with a mere \$20 million. And I would certainly be more interesting. I'd even be happy with \$10 million. Even \$5 million come to think of it – or even \$1 million.

Yes, I accept: happiness does not move up and down with one's bank balance.

Years ago I reported on a lecture by the Liverpool University psychologist, David Bentall, in which he said very happy people suffer a form of mental instability that distorts their view of the world. Really happy people, he said, might sometimes be mentally ill but they would be "unlikely to seek treatment".

Lolly Brower, a retired Johannesburg librarian, telephoned me after reading of Bentall's theory in my newspaper column.

"I am worried," she said with a little laugh that was immediately indicative of her condition. "Most of the time I am a happy person but now you tell me it's a form of insanity. What am I to do?"

First, I said, she must not believe everything she reads in the newspaper (outside of my own column that is).

Second: she must keep her happiness to herself. Many people might feel insecure at the thought of there being a happy person freely roaming the neighbourhood.

Third: she must seek professional help.

Lolly then asked, "What would the treatment do?"

It would, I told her, make her unhappy like the rest of us. "But that's absurd," she said with a slightly louder laugh. I could now hear hisses in the background, presumably from people trying to doze in the library's reference section. They were no doubt pointing vigorously at the SILENCE and STILTE signs.

"You mean I would have to pay good money to a specialist until, eventually, I'm thoroughly depressed?"

"No," I said, "not thoroughly depressed. Just miserable. It's so easy. Think of it, there's so much to be unhappy about. There's the petrol price and the price of cheese; there's VAT; our politicians; Zimbabwe; government corruption; Eskom, crime; the constant din of taxis crashing...

"Being normal doesn't necessarily rule out the occasional smile," I said. "But avoid actually laughing because, when you come to consider the state of the country, you could easily become hysterical and have to go around asking people to slap your face."

Too late. I could hear Lolly's laugh hitting high C.

Above her shrieks and sobs I could hear people shouting "Silence!, "Stilte!" and "I'm a psychiatrist, let me through," and What book is she reading? Because I want it next!"
